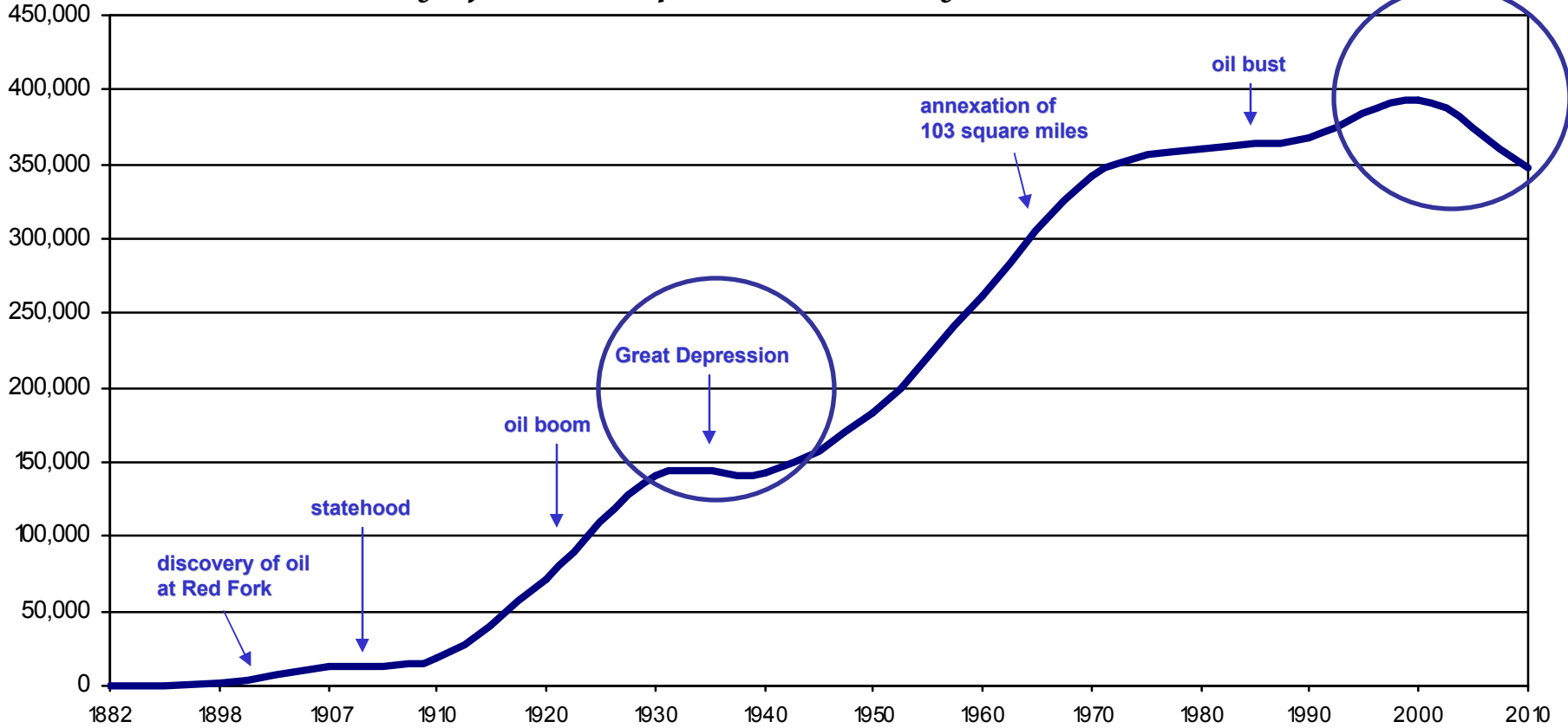

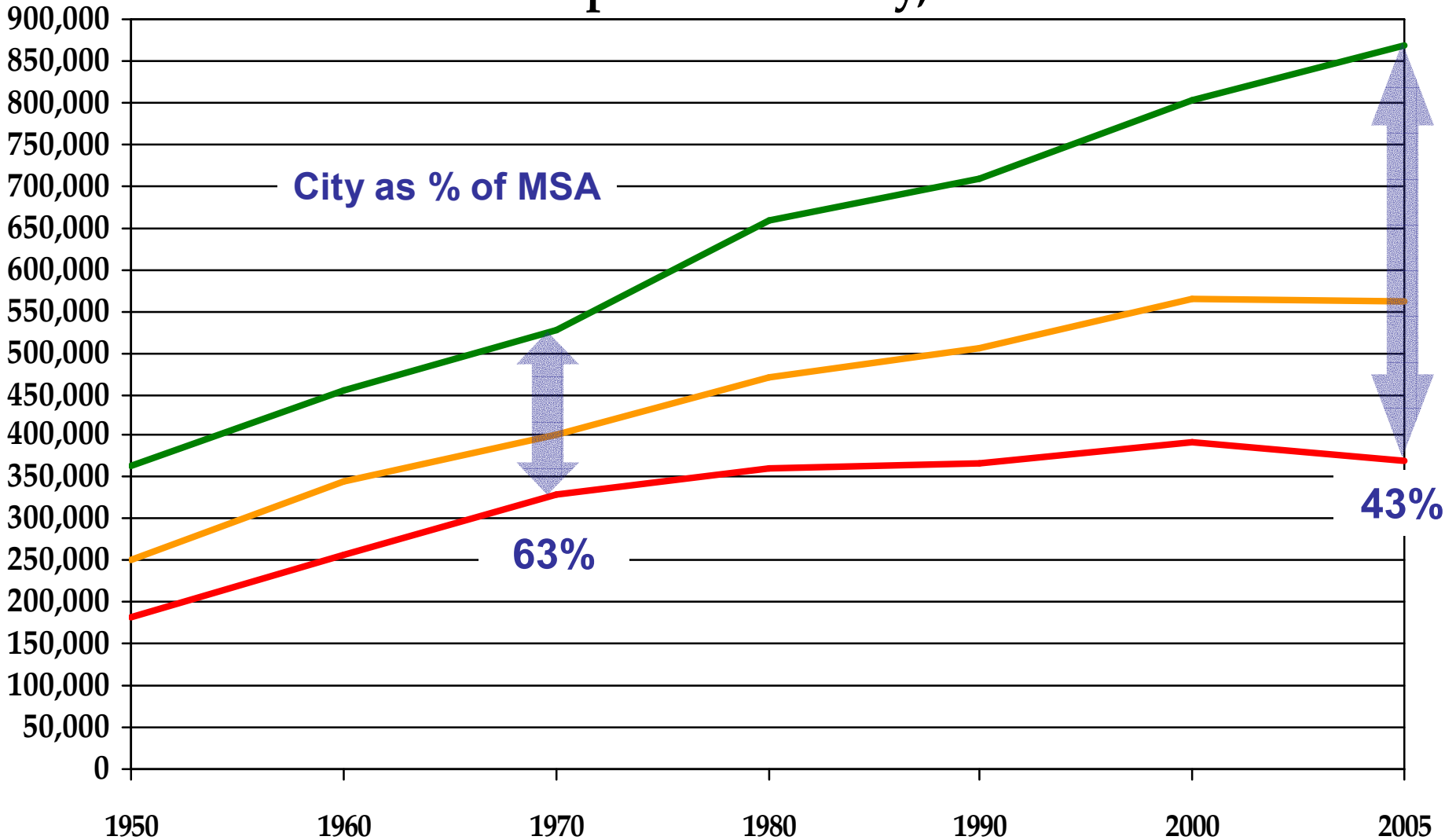

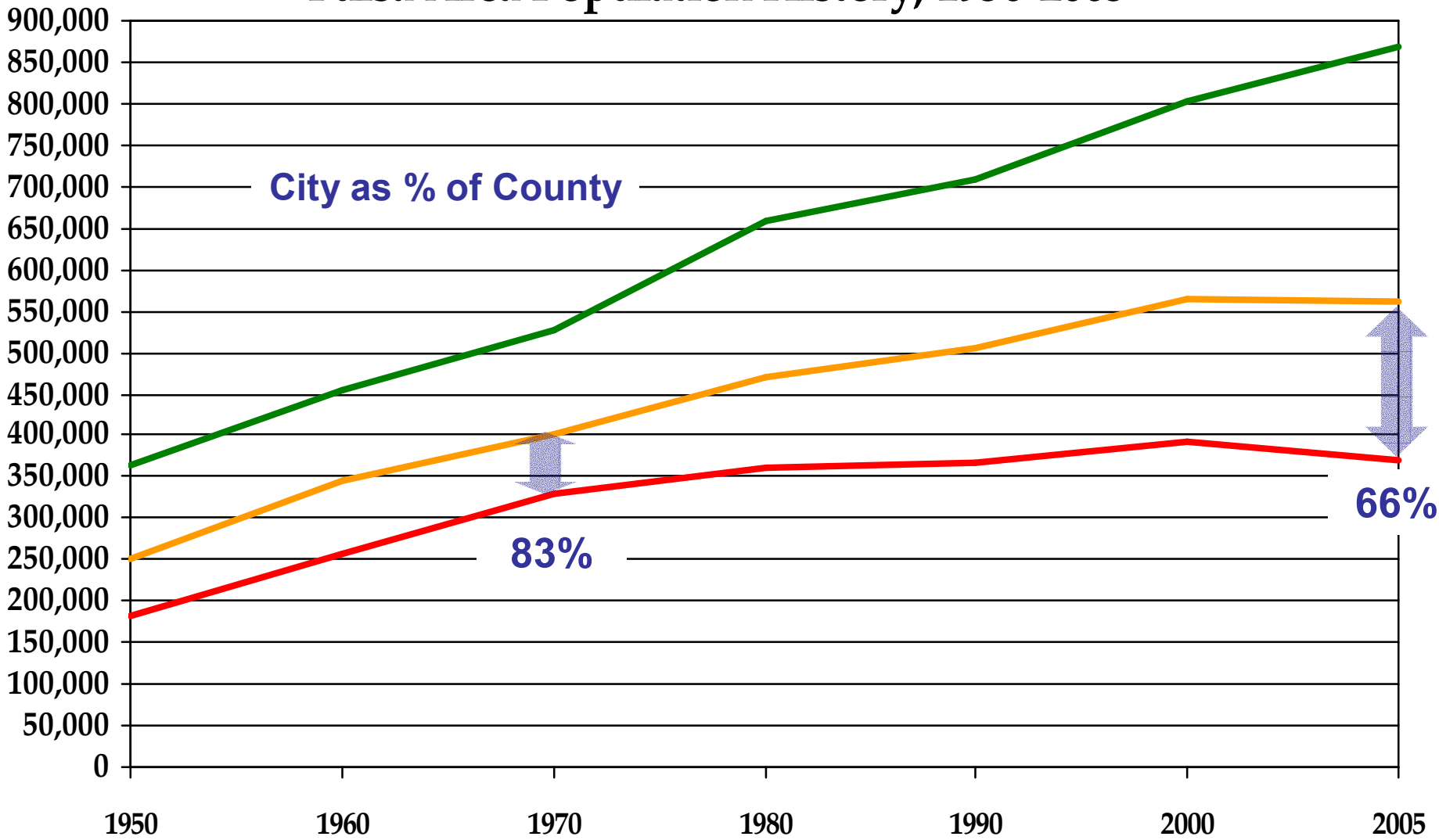

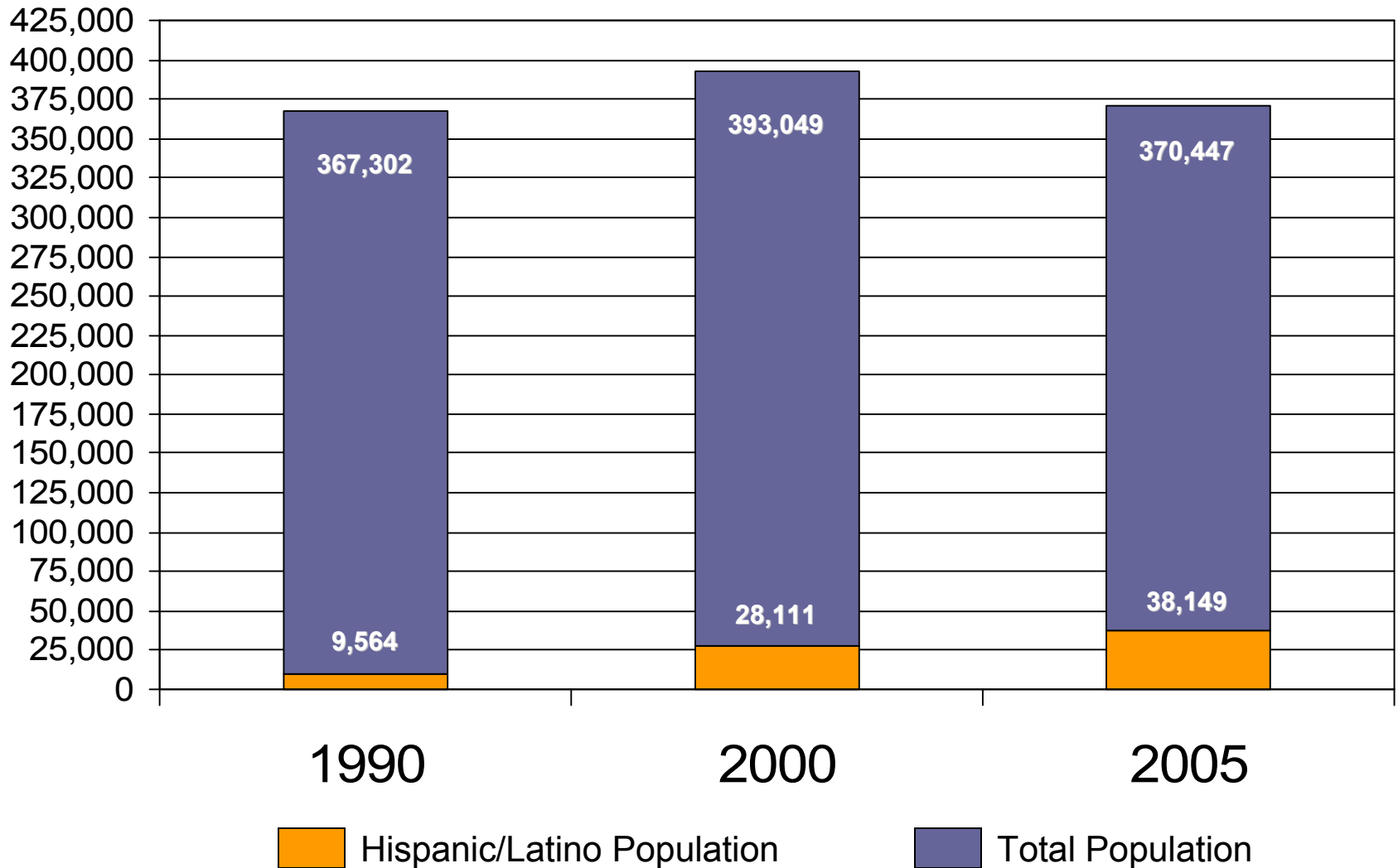

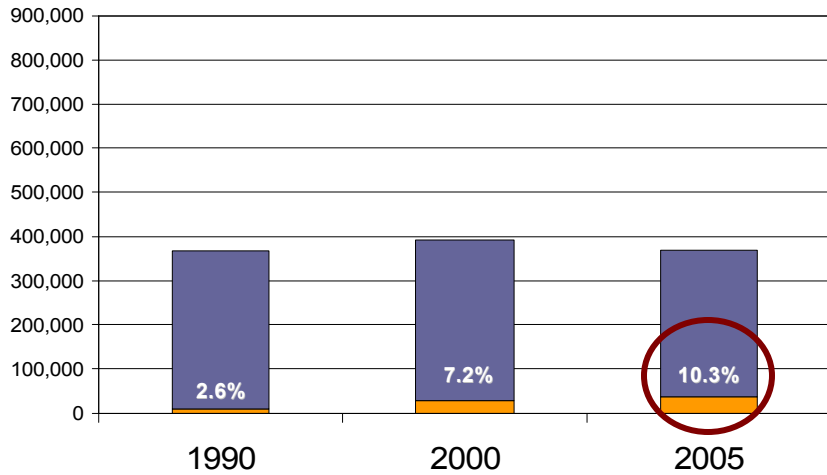

The City of Tulsa's Hispanic and Latino populations have grown considerably over the last 15 years, as the city's general population has stagnated.

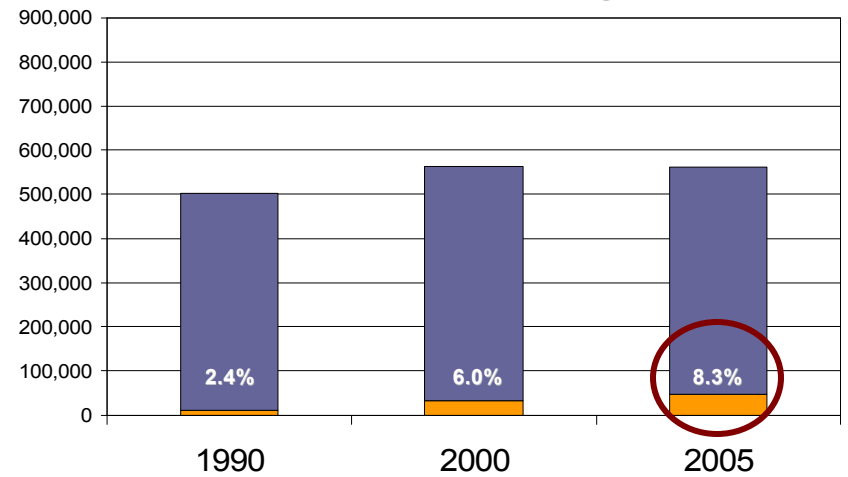
City of Tulsa Hispanic/Latino Population (Any Race), 1990-2005



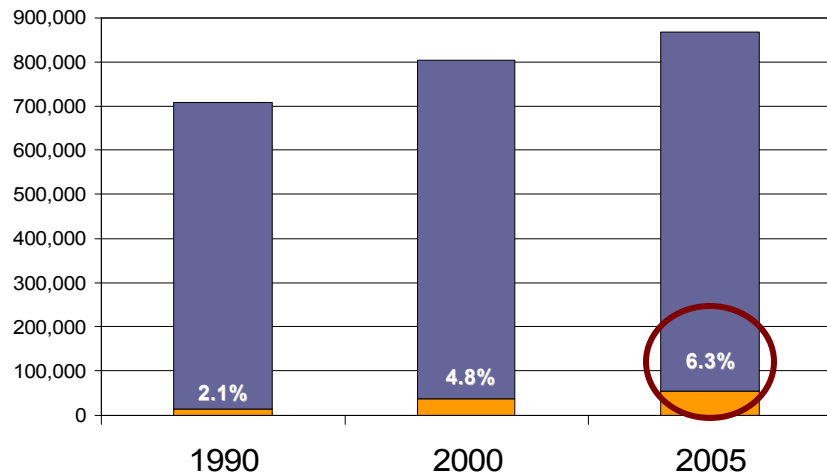

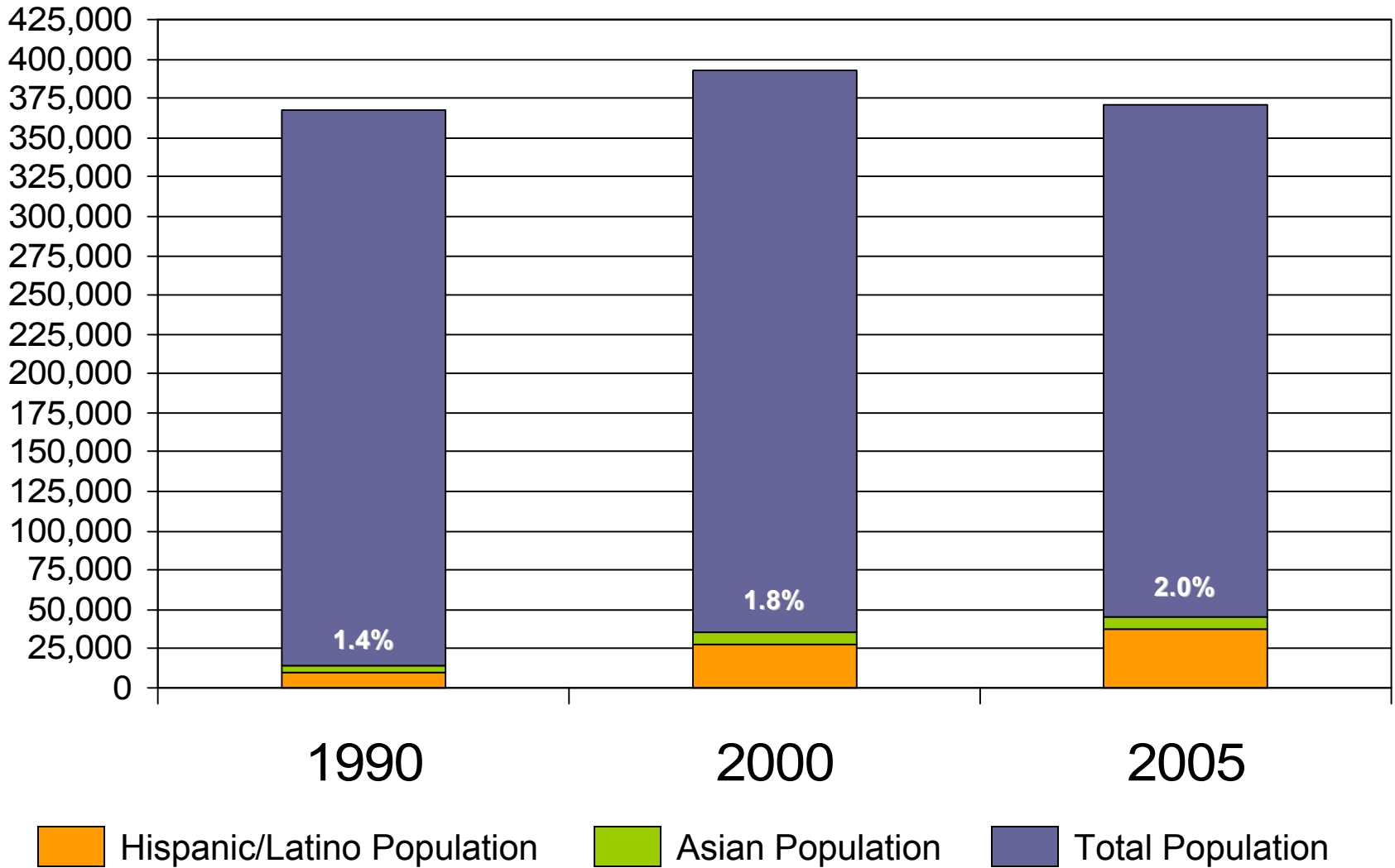

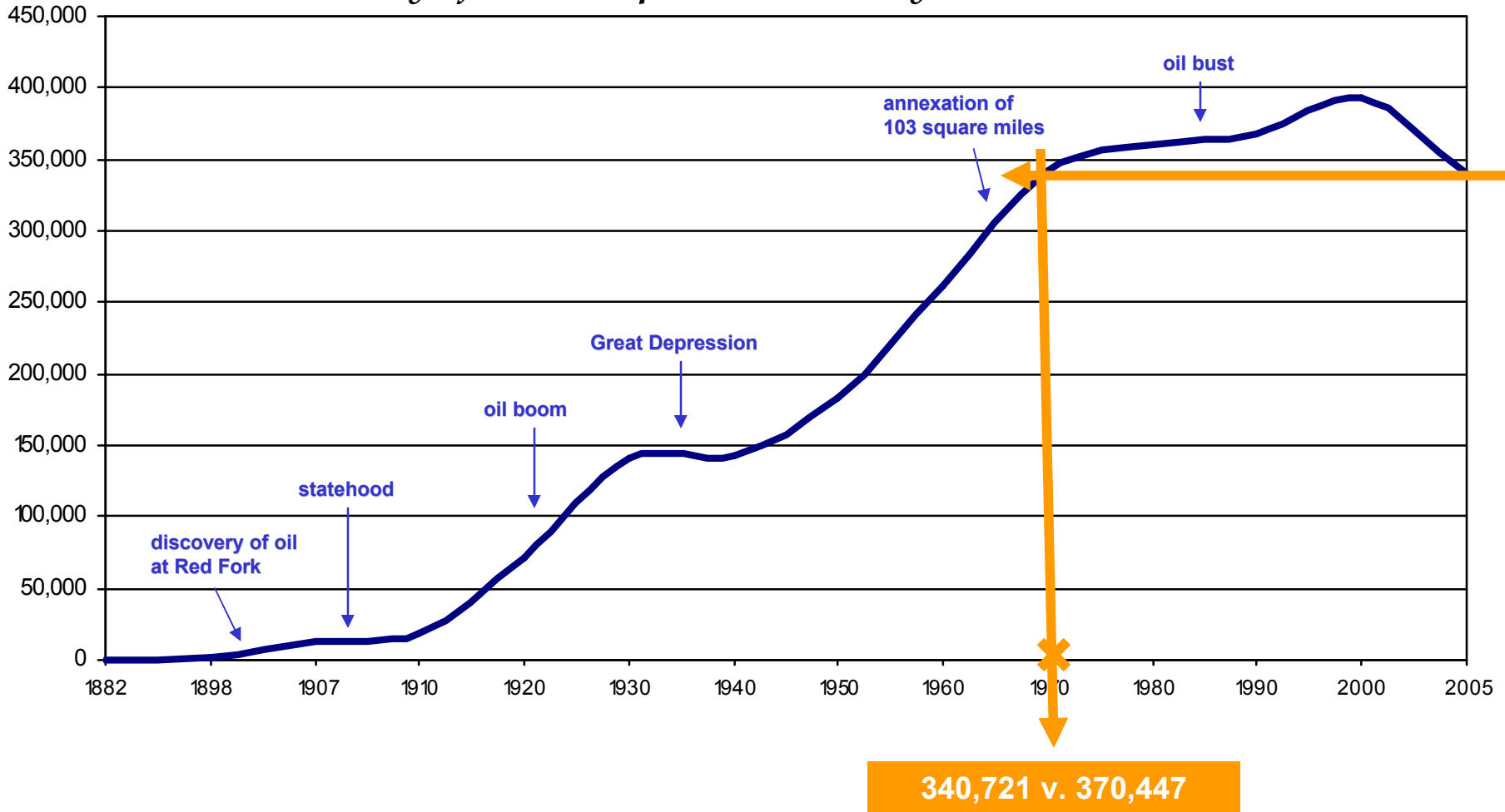

City of Tulsa Asian Population, 1990-2005

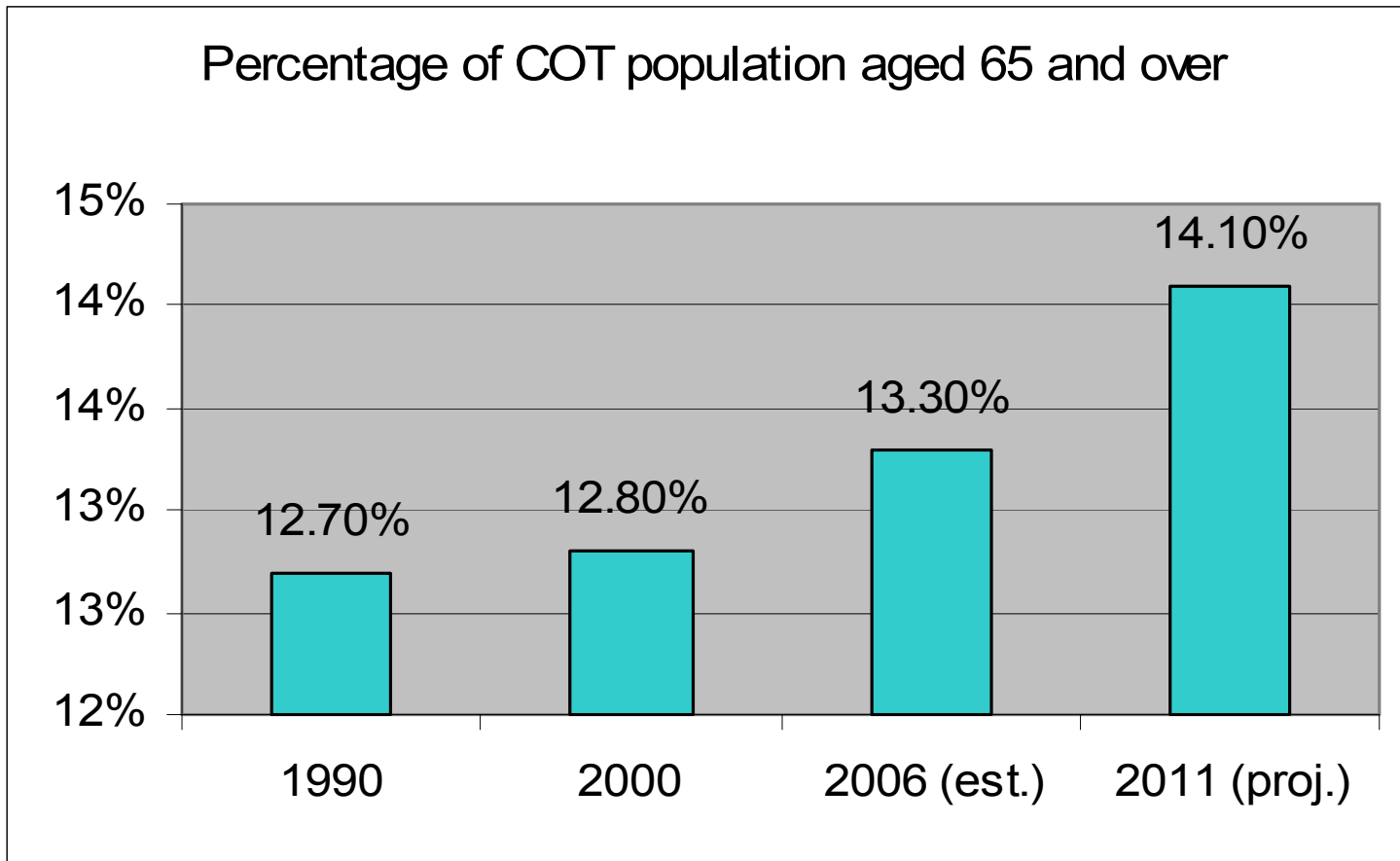


Without Hispanic/Latino and Asian Population Growth of the Last 15 Years?

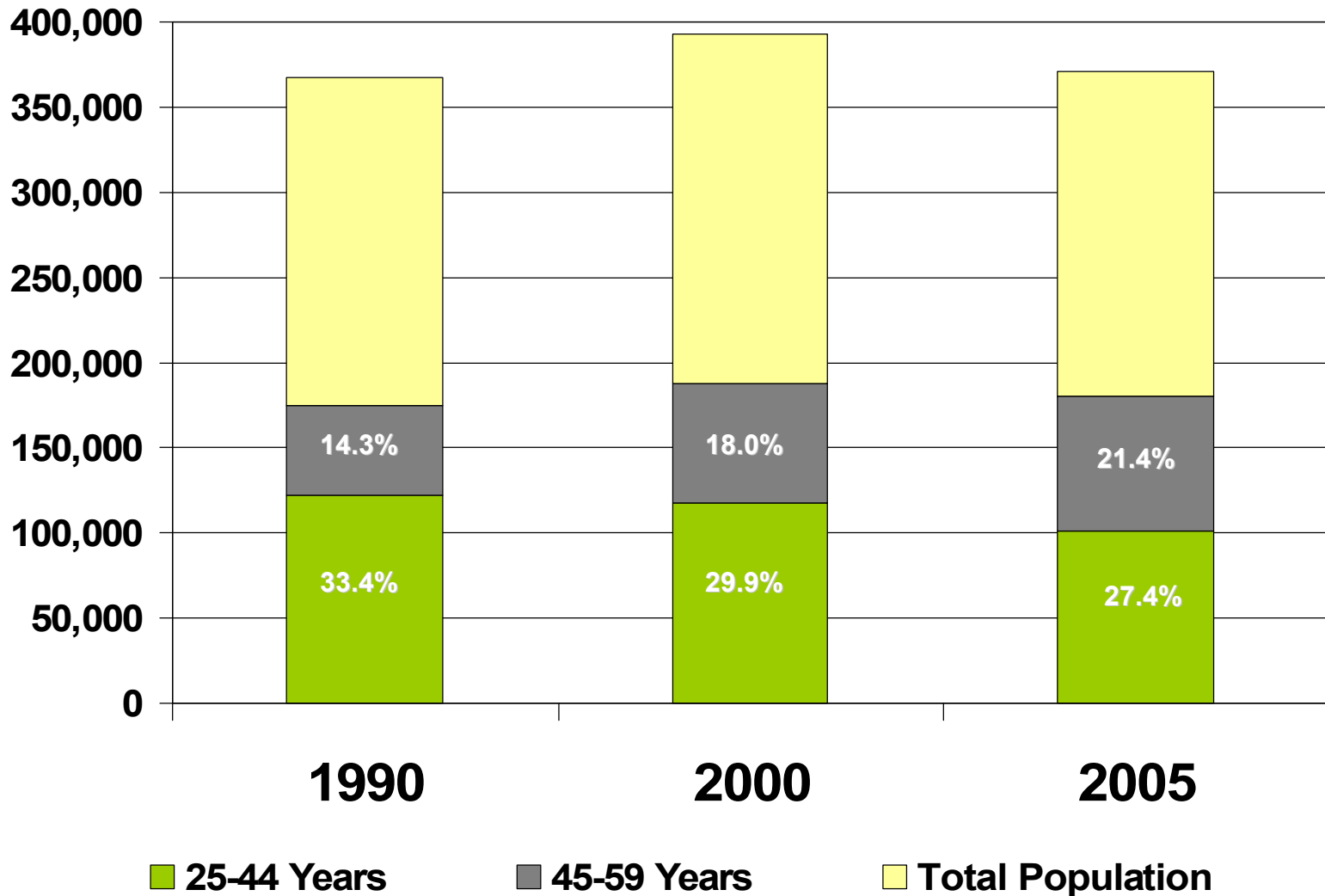

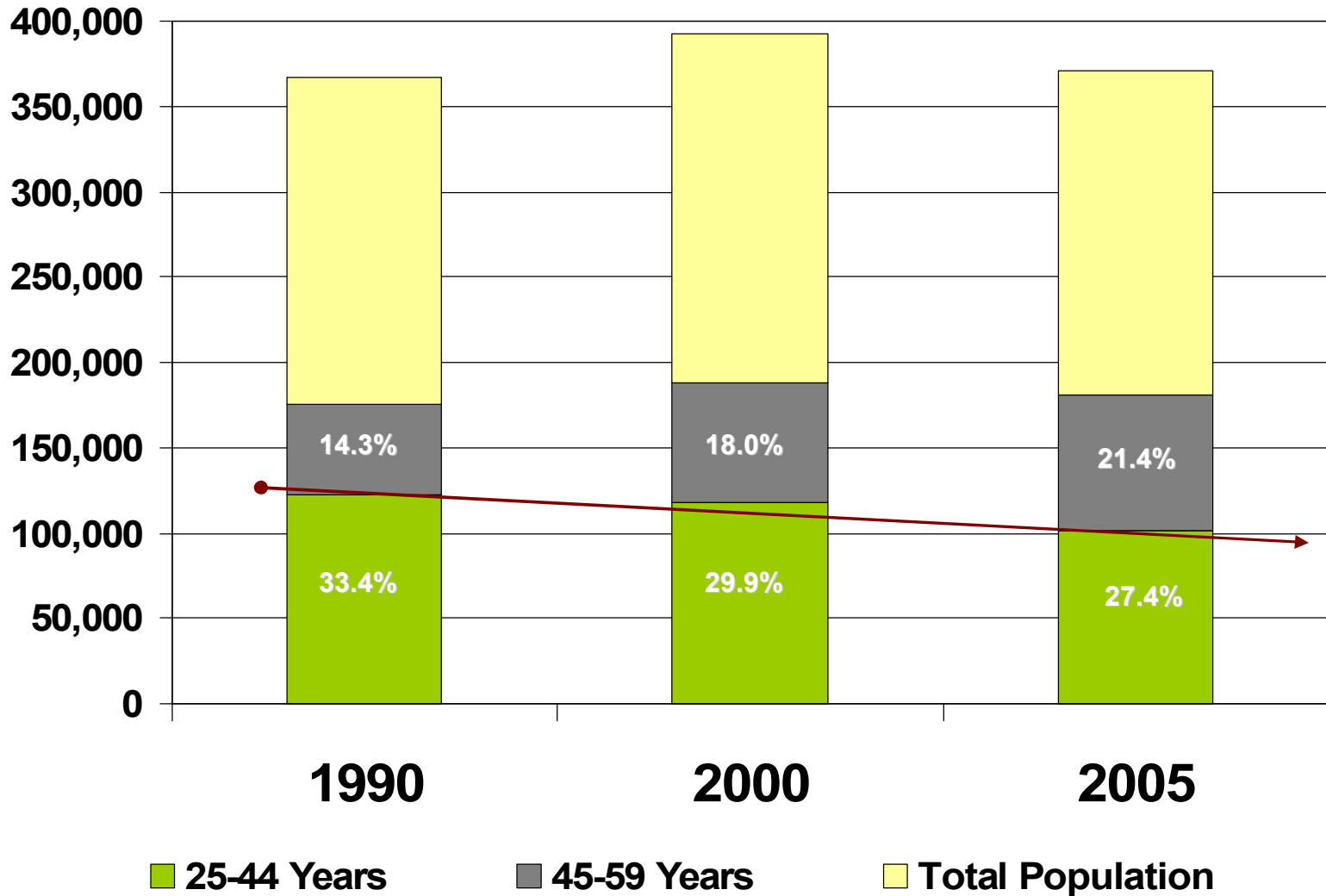
The City's population is aging



In addition to the demographic shift to the suburbs, a wave of 'boomer' retirements will soon impact the city's workforce.

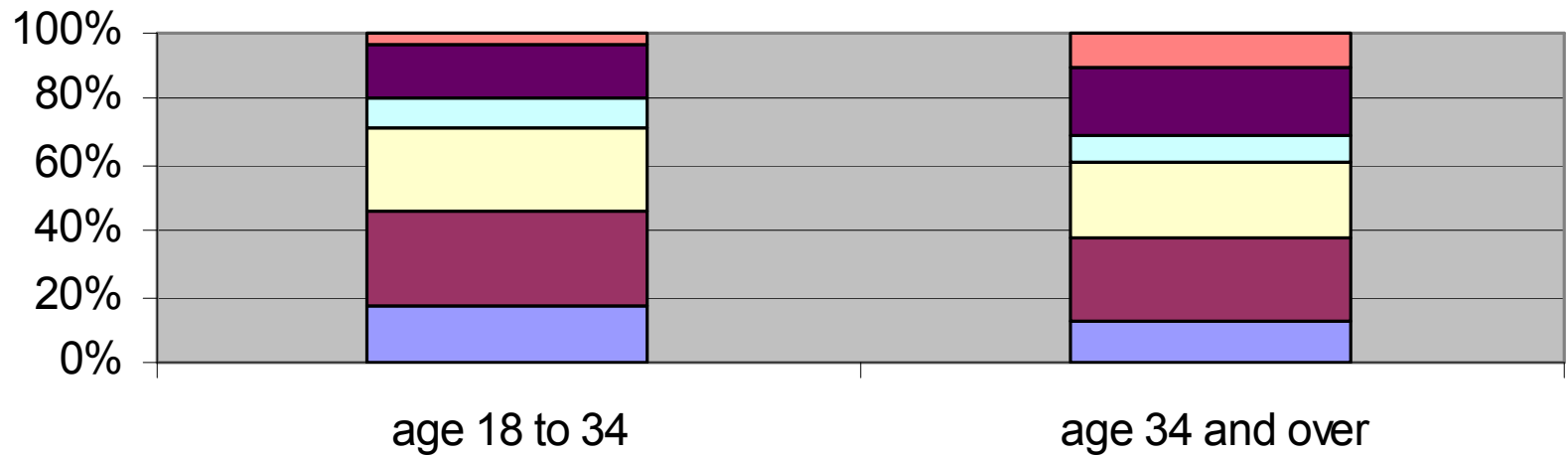


... and there are fewer younger people to replace them in the workforce.



Older Tulsans have higher educational attainment

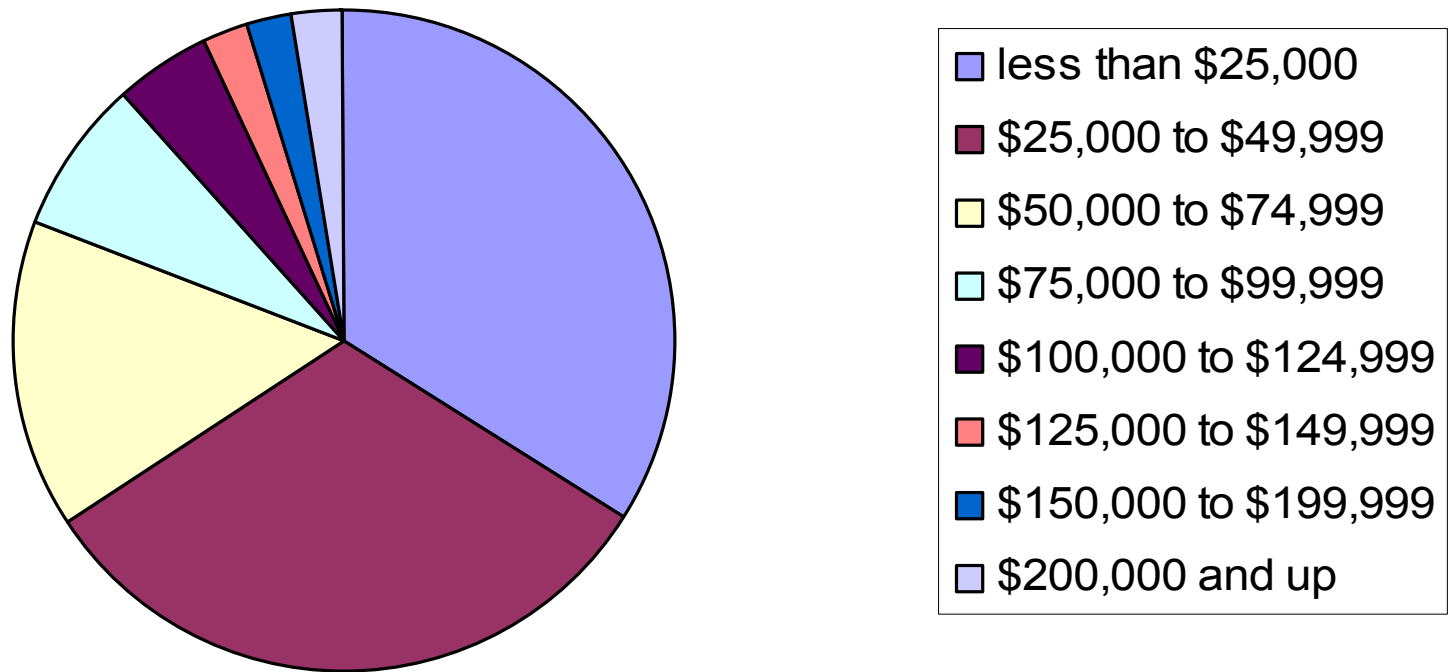
Educational Attainment of Adults, 2005



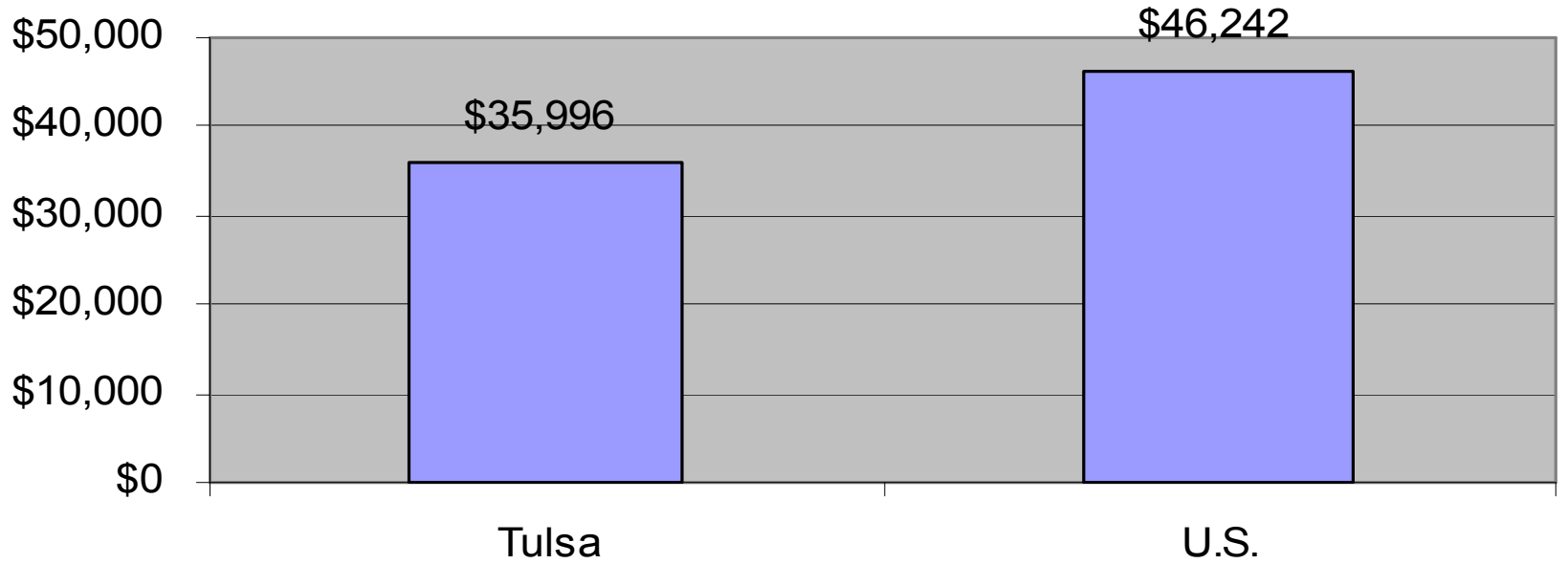

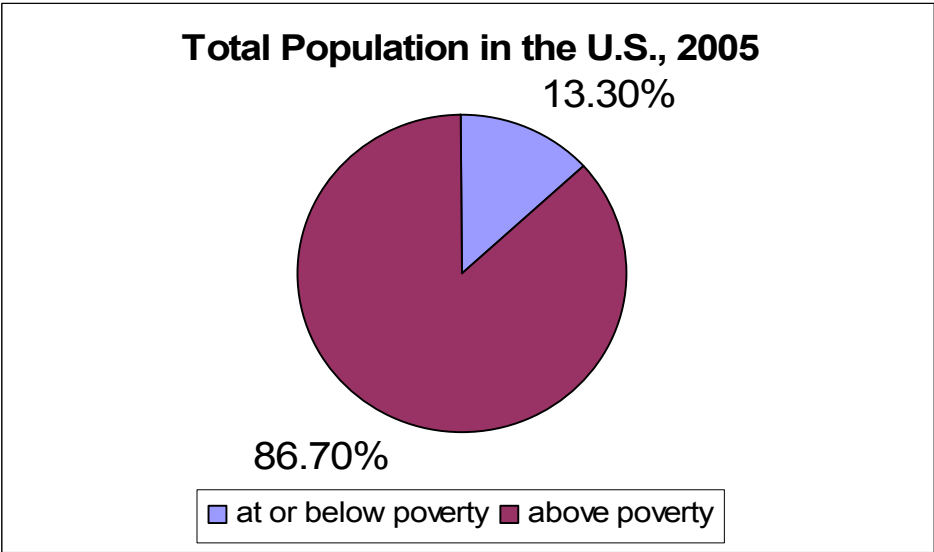
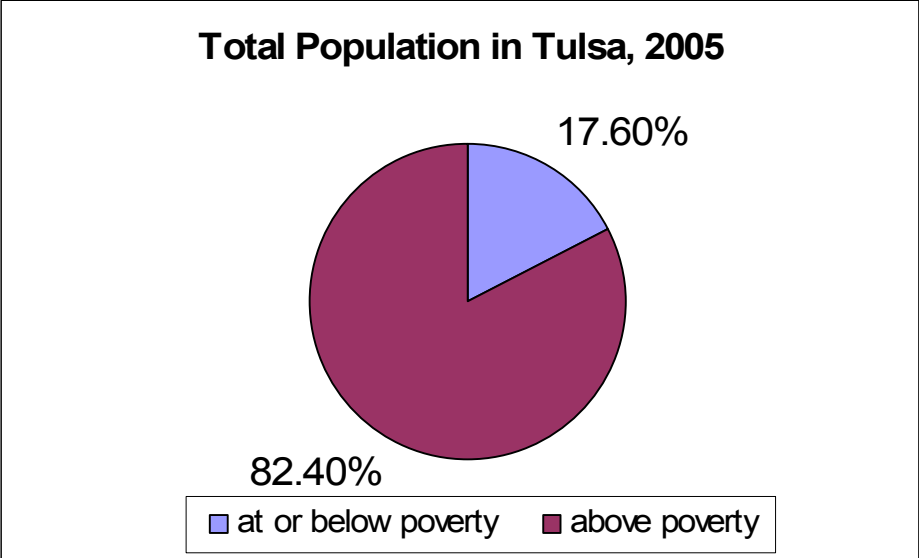
Household Income, 2005



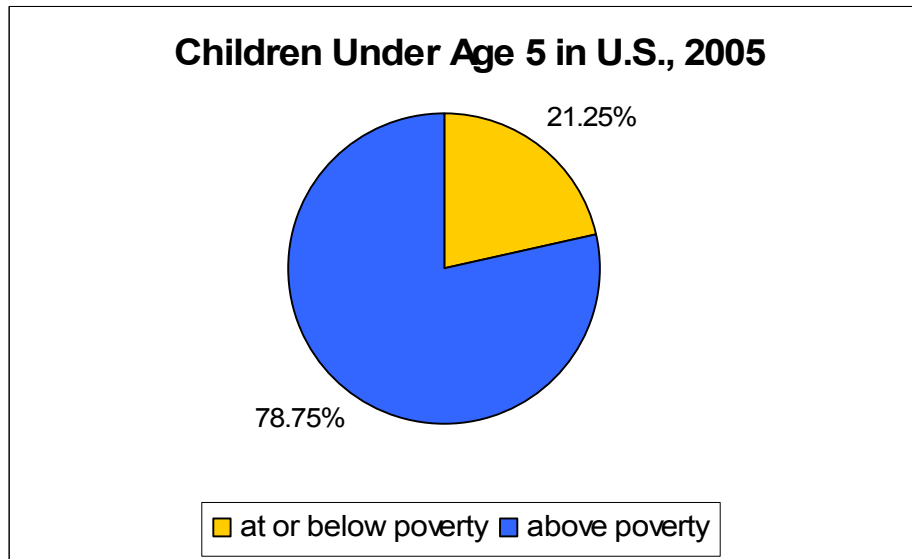
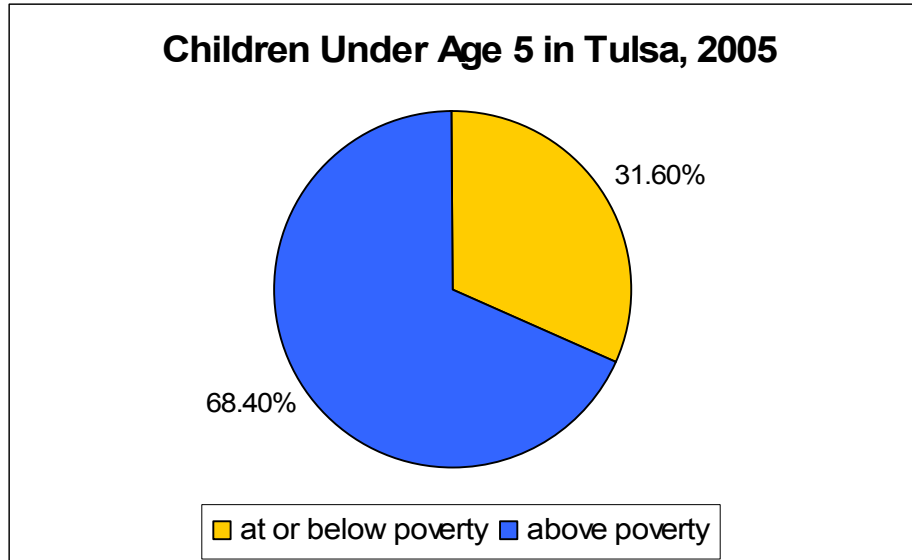
Median Household Income, Tulsa vs. U.S. 2005



Tulsa has higher poverty than the national average



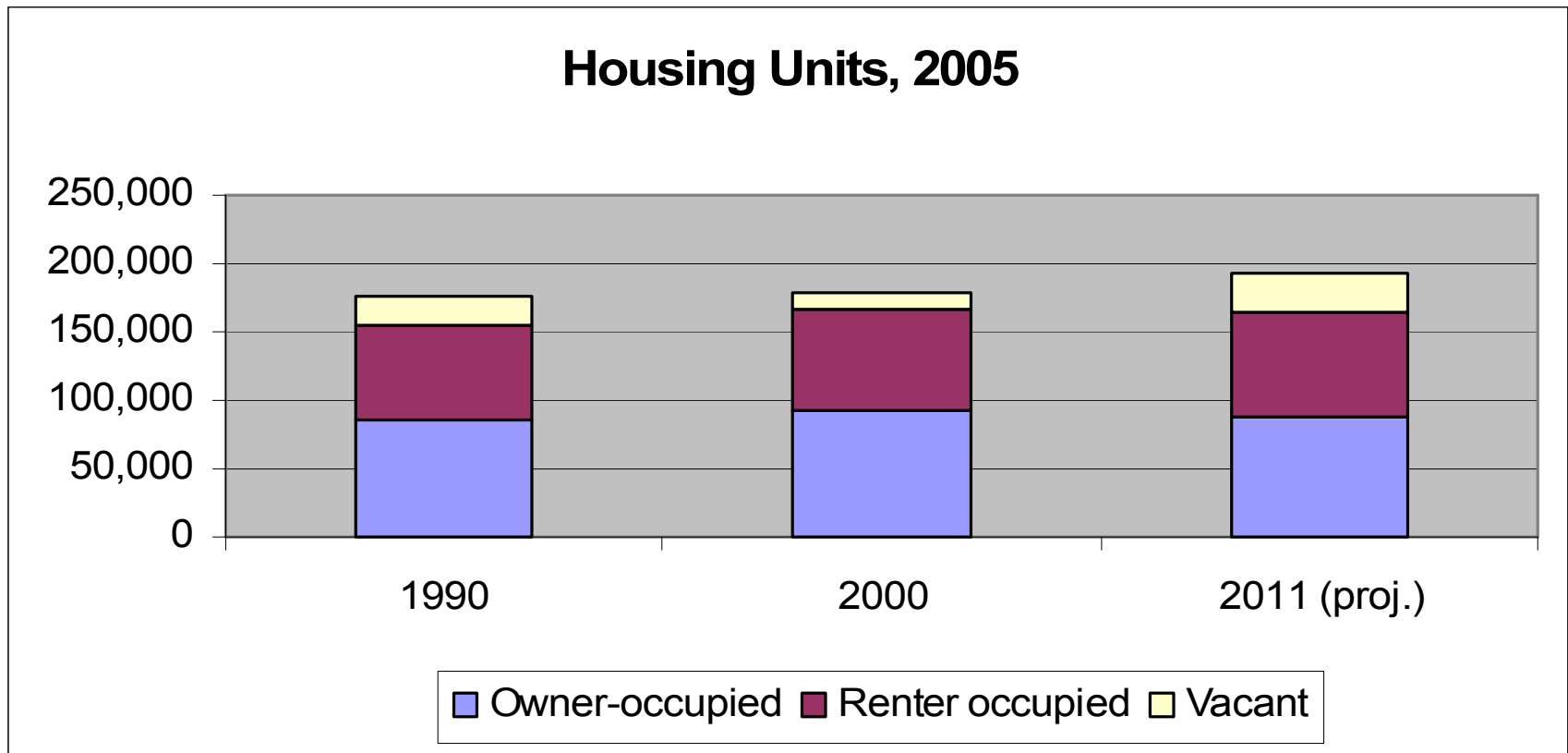
Tulsa has more young children in poverty than the national average



Tulsa has a higher proportion of uninsured population than the nation.

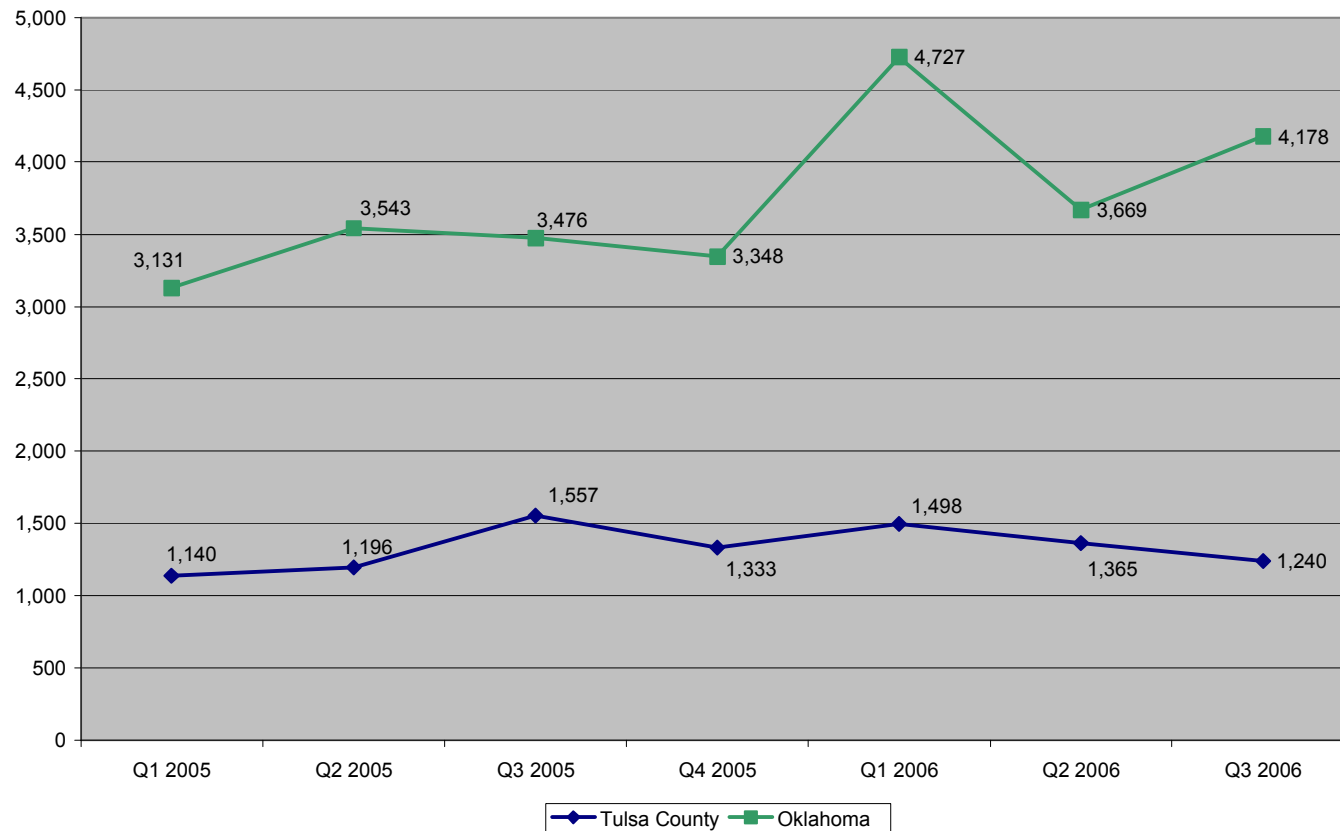

Home ownership remains relatively flat in Tulsa, although vacancies are projected to increase.

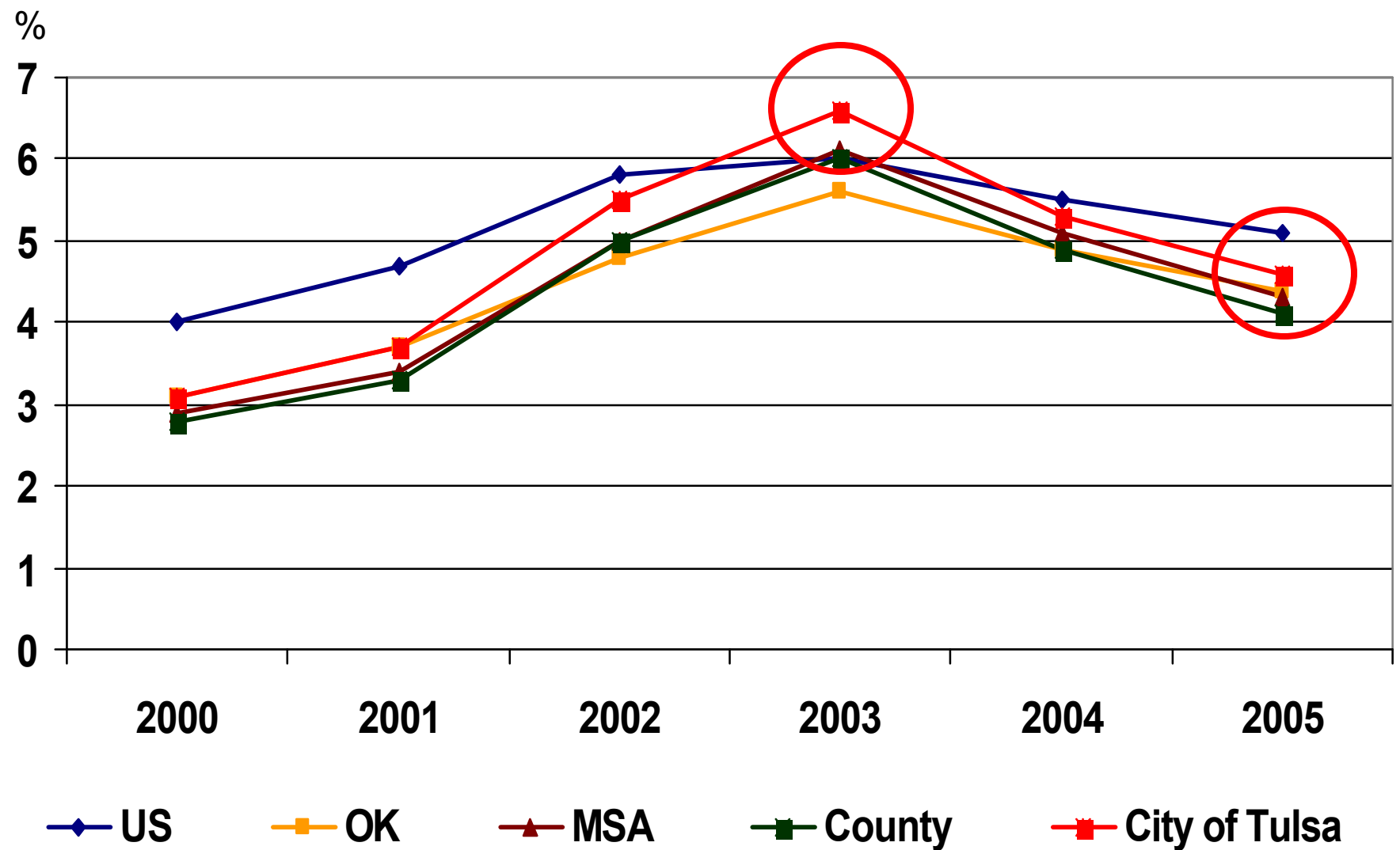


Housing foreclosures are down from their peak in Q3 2005, but there are almost 8 times as many homes in foreclosure than five years ago.
