On January 23, 2006 the Vision 2025- Tulsa Neighborhood Fund Task Force met to review the scoring of the applications for the 2nd Phase of the Tulsa Neighborhood Fund program and to develop a recommendation for the Vision 2025 Oversight Committee for Mayoral approval.

Minor modifications were made to the Phase 2 guidelines in order to improve the process. The Phase 2 process began in the summer of 2005. 29 Concept Screening Forms were received on new projects in September 2005, and 23 were recommended for acceptance.

92 applicants from Phase 1 and 23 applicants from Phase 2 received invitations to submit applications for new projects. 61 responses were submitted during the application process. The committee scored the 61 projects and following are the 54 projects recommended for approval by the Mayor. The 54 recipients' requests range from \$700 to the maximum of \$25,000 and total \$1,019,124.

About \$2 million were put in the Neighborhood Fund after voters approved Proposition Four of the Vision 2025 Package in September 2003. The Task Force will accept applications for the remaining \$840,000 during Phase 3, which is scheduled to begin in April.
