

**PUBLIC NOTICE - US HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HUD)
SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE CONSOLIDATED PLAN/ACTION PLANS FOR
CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA
OCTOBER 1, 2008 – SEPTEMBER 30, 2009
OCTOBER 1, 2009 – SEPTEMBER 30, 2010**

The City is planning to propose a substantial amendment to the Consolidated Plan/Annual Plans for program years 2008-2009 and 2009-2010. The purpose of this Public Notice is to solicit comments from Tulsans on the proposed amendment.

Due to changes in the economic climate of the housing market and to expedite the number of affordable housing units for low to moderate income individuals, the City of Tulsa is proposing to reallocate HOME funds for the following projects:
