

**Public Notice / Public Hearing  
Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP)  
Proposed use of Funds**

The Community Action Project of Tulsa County (CAPTC) in conjunction with the City of Tulsa is revising its Request for Information (RFI) for Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) entitlement funds in the amount of \$4,346,397 and remaining NSP funding under the "Remaining 20%" category of the State Plan in the amount of \$1,250,000 administered by Oklahoma Department of Commerce (ODOC). Based on the current Information and analysis, CAPTC and the City of Tulsa are proposing to combine the two amounts of NSP funds to be targeted towards the acquisition of Cimarron Apartments at 13201 East 31<sup>st</sup> Street Tulsa, OK.
