RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA, REQUESTING QUALITY EVENT DESIGNATION FOR THE 2022 USA BMX GRAND NATIONALS AND RACE OF CHAMPIONS ("EVENT"), TO BE HELD NOVEMBER 25-27, 2022; IDENTIFYING ELIGIBLE EXPENSES FOR PAYMENT THROUGH DISTRIBUTION OF CAPTURED REVENUES TO THE HOST COMMUNITY; IDENTIFYING THE TULSA SPORTS COMMISSION AS THE EVENT'S CERTIFIED SPONSOR; IDENTIFYING THE CITY OF TULSA AS THE EVENT'S HOST COMMUNITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, was selected as the location for the 2022 USA BMX Grand Nationals and Race of Champions, an existing event that is a national competition produced by USA BMX, a nationally-recognized organization, to be held November 25-27, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Tulsa, Oklahoma, was selected to host the Event through a competitive site selection process in which at least one site not located in the State of Oklahoma was considered; and

WHEREAS, the City of Tulsa shall serve as the Event's Host Community; and

WHEREAS, the Tulsa Sports Commission shall serve as the Event's Certified Sponsor; and

WHEREAS, it is intended that application be made to the Oklahoma Tax Commission for designation of the Event as a "Quality Event" under the provisions of the Oklahoma Administrative Code Section 710:95-21-1 et seq. (the "OTC Rules") and for payment of certain state sales tax revenues as therein provided.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL AND THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1: That the Tulsa Sports Commission, the Certified Sponsor for the Event, intends to use eligible local support amounts in order to successfully host the Event, including but not limited to the estimated budget outlined below totaling \$169,002:

Section 2: That the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, as an incorporated city of the State of Oklahoma, shall serve as the Event's "Host Community," as defined in Section 710:95-21-2 of the OTC Rules.

Section 3: That the Tulsa Sports Commission, as the organization authorized to promote and conduct a quality event, and which is incurring expenses for the promotion of such event to be conducted within the corporate limits of an eligible municipality or an unincorporated area within a county, shall serve as the Event's "Certified Sponsor" as defined in Section 710:95-21-2 of the OTC Rules.

Section 4: That the type of expenses eligible for payment through distribution of captured revenues to the City of Tulsa as "Host Community" shall include, but not be limited to the type of expenses set forth in Section 1 above and all other expenses of advertising, facility rental, promotional materials and security related to the Event.

Section 5: That the City of Tulsa, as the "Host Community" for the Event, shall issue all incentive payments from the Oklahoma Tax Commission as set forth in Section 710:95-21-11 of the OTC Rules to the Tulsa Sports Commission, as the "Certified Sponsor" for the Event, for costs incurred in hosting the Event.

Section 6: That an emergency is hereby declared to exist for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare, by reason whereof this Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its adoption and approval.

QUALITY EVENTS ACT APPLICATION:

2022 USA BMX Grand Nationals and Race of Champions – November 25-27, 2022

IMPACT TO THE CITY OF TULSA:

The Quality Events Act has **no impact** on local sales tax collections. The City of Tulsa does, however, stand to benefit greatly from the increase in sales tax dollars generated during the event, and the visitors who attend.

The event is anticipated to bring in **\$8.6 million** in total economic impact for the Tulsa region, generating over **\$198,000** in state sales tax collections. For the City of Tulsa, this event is expected to directly generate **\$177,000** in municipal sales tax dollars.

In addition to sales, the USA BMX Grand Nationals and Race of Champions event is expected to generate nearly **5,000 room nights** and bring in an estimated **12,000 athletes and spectators** who enjoy our city, eat in our restaurants, and buy goods from our local sellers.

QUALITY EVENTS ACT APPLICATION: 2022 USA BMX Grand Nationals and Race of Champions – November 25-27, 2022

Quality Events Act

The Quality Events Act was enacted by the State Legislature in 2010 to help attract and promote large-scale tourism events in Oklahoma. The Act went into effect on July 1, 2012, and was amended to allow an event's impact to be determined by a qualified economic analysis.

The Quality Events Act allows for local destination marketing organizations (DMOs), in partnership with their local communities, to capture a portion of the state sales tax generated by the Quality Event. DMOs are eligible to receive up to \$250,000 per event from the Oklahoma Tax Commission, based upon the event's economic impact.

2022 USA BMX Grand Nationals and Race of Champions

The Tulsa Sports Commission partners with USA BMX to host the Grand Nationals, with 2022 marking the first year of a new agreement to host the event in Tulsa. The event will be hosted over Thanksgiving weekend at the SageNet Center at Expo Square and includes the biggest night of racing in USA BMX's season. 2021's event drew in 3,705 athletes representing 49 states and 19 countries, with total attendance nearing 12,000.

ESection 4302 - Portion of Sales Tax Revenues to Promote Certain Events

Cite as: 68 O.S. § 4302 (OSCN 2022)

The Legislature finds that certain quality events conducted within the state have a significant economic impact. In order to assist with the promotion of such events and to assist the promoters and organizers of such events with the planning and performance of such events, the Legislature finds that it is in furtherance of an essential governmental function to provide a method by which an eligible municipality or an eligible county may utilize a portion of the state sales tax revenues derived from taxable transactions occurring within a designated area to promote certain qualifying events. The State of Oklahoma has a legitimate interest in economic development related to the occurrence of quality events and the Legislature finds that the use of state sales tax revenues authorized by this act provides a method by which the state can compete successfully in a national and global economy against other jurisdictions offering similar incentives for such events.

ESection 4304 - Designation of Events - Submission of Forms - Economic Impact Study

Cite as: 68 O.S. § 4304 (OSCN 2022)

A. Not later than thirty (30) days prior to the initial date of a quality event, a host community may designate:

1. The dates during which a quality event will be hosted; and

2. The type of expenses eligible for distribution of captured revenues to the host community including, but not limited to, advertising, facility rental, promotional materials and security.

B. Any designation made by a host community for purposes of the Oklahoma Quality Events Incentive Act shall be made pursuant to an ordinance or resolution duly adopted by the governing body of the host community.

C. A host community may only designate one quality event during the time frame in which a designated quality event will occur.

D. Within sixty (60) days of the date on which the host community adopts an ordinance or resolution pursuant to subsection A of this section, such host community shall submit to the Oklahoma Tax Commission, on such forms as the Tax Commission may prescribe, a copy of such ordinance or resolution, an economic impact study and the event history. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall designate a single employee or division responsible for processing information, making determinations and any other duties related to the Oklahoma Quality Events Incentive Act.

E. Within sixty (60) days from the date of receipt of the information from the host community as required by subsection D of this section, the Tax Commission shall approve or disapprove, in whole or in part, the submission and analysis of the required information. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce and the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department shall provide such assistance and information as requested by the Tax Commission.

ESection 4305 - Disclosure of Local Support Amounts - Analysis of Economic Impact Study - Payment

Cite as: 68 O.S. § 4305 (OSCN 2022)

A. The host community shall provide to the Oklahoma Tax Commission detailed information disclosing the total amount of eligible local support amounts for purposes of determining the amount of incremental state sales tax revenue that may be paid to a host community in which a quality event occurs.

B. The Tax Commission shall verify the amount of eligible local support amounts prior to making any payment to a host community.

C. After the conclusion of an event, the host community shall provide information related to the event, such as attendance figures, financial information or other public information held by the host community that the Tax Commission considers necessary to evaluate the actual economic impact of the event.

D. The Tax Commission shall compare the total amount of eligible local support amounts with the total amount of incremental state sales tax revenues remitted by vendors, such revenues to be established through the economic impact study.

E. If the Tax Commission determines through an analysis of the economic impact study that the total amount of incremental state sales tax revenues is zero, no payment shall be made to a host community.

F. If the Tax Commission determines through an analysis of the economic impact study that the total amount of incremental state sales tax revenues is greater than zero, but less than the total amount of eligible local support amounts, the Tax Commission shall make payment, subject to the limitations of subsection I of this section, to the host community of the quality event in an amount equal to the incremental state sales tax revenues.

G. If the Tax Commission determines through an analysis of the economic impact study that the total amount of incremental state sales tax revenues is at least equal to the amount of eligible local support amounts, the Tax Commission shall make payment, subject to the limitations of subsection I of this section, to the host community in which the quality event occurs in an amount equal to, but not greater than, the eligible local support amounts.

H. No payment shall be made to any host community from a source other than the incremental state sales tax revenues, if any, derived from state sales tax remittances of vendors as a result of the quality event, as determined by an economic impact study verified by the Oklahoma Tax Commission.

I. No payment shall be made to any host community in excess of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) for a single quality event regardless of the amount of eligible local support paid by the host community.
