

Policy Statement

Background Information

The City of Tulsa has several Destination Districts, areas of town noted for their cultural or historic significance. The four (4) Destination Districts are: East Tulsa, Greenwood, Kendall-Whittier and Route 66. The attached Ordinance will allow representatives of these Destination Districts to decorate the fire hydrants in those Districts with identifiable, iconic colors and patterns, to build community cohesion and civic pride, and to stimulate tourism. The fire hydrants are managed by the Fire Department and the Water and Sewer Department. The decorations must be reviewed and approved by these departments, and also by the Tulsa Metropolitan Utility Authority (TMUA), the City Council and the City of Tulsa Arts Commission.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 13 TULSA REVISED ORDINANCES (“TRO”), “FIRE DEPARTMENT”, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION, SECTION 202.1, TO IMMEDIATELY FOLLOW THE EXISTING SECTION 202, “FIRE HYDRANTS PROTECTED”; THE NEW SECTION 202.1 TO BE ENTITLED “DECORATED FIRE HYDRANTS WITHIN DESTINATION DISTRICTS”; ALLOWING THE DECORATION OF FIRE HYDRANTS WITHIN THE CITY OF TULSA’S DESTINATION DISTRICTS; PROVIDING RULES, REGULATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS FOR SUCH DECORATION; IDENTIFYING FUNDING FOR THE DECORATION; REQUIRING APPROVAL OF THE DECORATIONS FROM FIRE, WATER AND SEWER DEPARTMENTS AND THE CITY COUNCIL; REQUIRING APPROVAL FROM THE CITY OF TULSA ARTS COMMISSION; REQUIRING AN OPERATIONAL PERMIT; OBSERVING THE PROTECTIONS FOR FIRE HYDRANTS FOUND IN OTHER ORDINANCES; PERMITTING THE REMOVAL OF THE DECORATION AND RESTORATION OF FIRE HYDRANTS IF ADJUDGED NECESSARY IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST; SETTING FORTH A REPEALER OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TULSA:

Section 1. There is hereby enacted a new section of Title 13 TRO, that is, Section 202.1, entitled, “Decorated Fire Hydrants within Destination Districts” to immediately follow Section 202 and immediately precede Section 203.

“Section 202.1. Decorated Fire Hydrants within Destination Districts.

Fire hydrants within the City’s official Destination Districts may be decorated or painted as permitted by this section.

- A. Representatives of the Destination District, in consultation with City personnel and the City Councilor representing the district, may develop decorative colors and designs to paint on fire hydrants, for the purpose of identifying the Destination District, stimulating tourism and public interest in the district, and fostering community pride and engagement.
- B. Representatives of the Destination District shall be responsible for the decorating of the fire hydrants according to an agreed-upon plan, and for maintenance of the decoration. Destination Districts shall provide the funding for the painting; no City funds shall be used.
- C. No decorative color or design shall be painted on a fire hydrant until approval of same be obtained from the Fire Department, the Water and Sewer Department, the City of Tulsa Arts Commission, and the City Council. An operational permit shall be required per Section 105.6.49 of Title 14 TRO.

- D. No message, slogan, or political or religious symbol shall be applied to a fire hydrant. No fire hydrant shall be painted to look like any human being, fictional character, animal or other creature. Nothing herein shall qualify a fire hydrant as a public forum.
- E. This ordinance shall apply only to fire hydrants within the official Destination Districts of the City of Tulsa, namely: East Tulsa Main Street, Historic Greenwood, Kendall-Whittier and Route 66, and not to fire hydrants throughout the rest of the City. This Ordinance may be amended to add new destination districts as they are created.
- F. Pertinent ordinances, including Section 202, above, Title 11-C TRO Section 206, Title 27 TRO Sections 1302, 1800 and 1805, and Title 37 TRO Section 522, among others, shall continue in full force and effect, except for the provisions of this Section 202.1. Nothing herein shall be allowed to impair public safety or interfere with the operation and maintenance function of a fire hydrant.
- G. The City of Tulsa may revoke this permission at any time, for good cause shown. Upon such revocation, the fire hydrant shall be restored to its previous condition and appearance.”

Section 2. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are now expressly repealed.

Section 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason found to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance or any part thereof.

Section 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. That an emergency is now declared to exist for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage, approval and publication.
