All participants must adhere to the terms of the "2019 Tulsa Native American Day Parade Rules and Participation Agreement" set forth below. A violation of these rules will result in your expulsion from the 2019 parade and future parades. The enjoyment and safety of our participants and parade attendees is of paramount importance to the Native American Day committee. We appreciate your cooperation to ensure a successful event.

***Please read this form. Your signature on Page 1 of the 2019 Tulsa Native American Day Parade Application will serve as your agreement to comply with all provisions stated below and also agree to assure that the organization you are representing will do the same. Email completed application to TulsaNADParade@gmail.com.***

All parade participants, floats and vehicles will be in place and lined up by 11 am Central Time on October 14, 2019. The assembly area details will be provided to the contact person listed on the parade application, after the application has been approved. Tardiness and late attendance by the designated time could be grounds for exclusion from the 2019 Native American Day Parade.

No amplified music or speech will be allowed in the parade unless specifically approved by the Parade Marshals.

Candy and other may be handed to parade attendees. HOWEVER, UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCE MAY CANDY OR OTHER ITEMS BE THROWN.

No stopping is permitted unless directed to do so by parade officials. Entries must start and restart immediately when directed by the officials.

Parade participants shall not represent itself as a political group, advocacy group and or as an individual advocate of a particular political viewpoint. Each individual will represent themselves, individually or collectively; not as a particular political persuasion and not those of who are affiliated with a particular political party or political organization or political viewpoint.

No parade participant will wear hats, t-shirts, signage, or have amplified sound that promotes a political candidate. Political candidates, their staff or volunteers are not permitted to publicly promote the candidate while participating in the Native American Day parade.

Clothing, vehicle displays, decorations, wording or images on signage will be such that it can be displayed in public and in front of minors. For example, prohibited images and signage include, but are not limited to: discrimination of any kind based on race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, group, organization or tribe, or any pro- or anti-abortion sentiment, or sexual innuendo.

Parade Marshals have the authority to demand that a parade participant, group or individual, remove and/or discard images or signage deemed to violate this agreement. Failure to comply with the Parade Marshals' demands will lead to expulsion and disqualification from the 2019 parade.

Any organization or individual misrepresenting the intent to participate in accordance with the rules set by the Parade Committee will be denied participation in the 2019 parade.

The Flag of the United States of America will be carried and or displayed in accordance with the specifications of the United States Flag Code. Link: <http://www.usflag.org/uscode36.html>

Federally recognized Tribal Governments will be permitted to carry or display their flag in the parade.

Any motor vehicle and/or trailer used in the parade will meet safety standards approved by the Tulsa Police Department. No driver will be permitted to operate a vehicle in the parade while impaired or for any purpose related to the parade.

Any person operating a motor vehicle in the parade staging area or on the parade route will be expected to obey all traffic laws, all instructions from Parade Marshals, and all instructions from law enforcement personnel and all conditions of participating in the parade.
