WHEREAS, the Greenwood section of the City of Tulsa possesses a rich historic and social value for the City of Tulsa and its people, and for the larger community and the nation; and

WHEREAS, the Greenwood section of the City of Tulsa has come to the attention of the National Park Service (see attached Exhibit "A"), the Oklahoma Historical Society, the Tulsa Preservation Commission, and other public and quasi-public bodies, for its historic significance; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate for the City of Tulsa to recognize this historic area;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF TULSA:

Section 1. The area of the City of Tulsa commonly known as Greenwood is hereby formally declared the "Historic Greenwood District"; and

Section 2. The "Historic Greenwood District" shall henceforth have the following identified boundaries:


North—East Pine Street

East—North Lansing Avenue

West—Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard (formerly known as North Cincinnati Avenue).
