In presented this request, the applicant indicated that he intended to provide "Car Hop Service" with the present use of the "Mr. T-Drive In".

There was no protest presented to this application.

There was then presented a Zoning Case Report from the Tulsa Metropolitan Area Planning Commission advising as follows:

"Size of Tract: 70 x 165 feet - Existing Use: Restaurant - Proposed Use: Car Hop Service (Drive-in)

Existing Conditions:

The property in question is presently developed with the "Mr. T." Drive-In Restaurant. It is located in that area along Peoria Avenue which is zoned in a U-3E general commercial classification, and uses along both sides of Peoria in this area are generally of a commercial nature. There is a large church immediately across 36th Street to the south. The properties to the east of the commercial zoning along Peoria are developed and used for single family residences of brack and frame and are of good quality. There is presently a 6-foot solid masonry wall located along the east line of the property in question separating the commercial use from the residence to the east. The U-3E zoning extends to a greater depth in the block between 36th Street and 36th Place than it does in the block in question. This places commercial zoning immediately across from residences on the north side of 36th Street.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

DENIAL, for the following reason:

- 1. Application is spot zone.
- 2. Tract is small; residences in close proximity.

#### ZONING COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

DENIAL, for the following reasons:

- Would be in violation to a plan adopted by the Commission for the development of this area.
- 2. U-3F District would allow other uses not desirable in this area.
- 3. Property is just across the street from a church."

Mrs. W. A. Dean, 1316 East 35th Place, then addressed the Commission, stating that she is protesting; that it is disturbing to the neighborhood with the honking of horns and the loud noises, and that with curb service it would only create a traffic problem. She stated that some have had their homes there for 35 years.

Mr. Joy G. Clayton, Attorney, was present, stating that he represents only himself; that he is objecting strongly to the zoning.

Mrs. Frank Thomas also addressed the Commission, stating that she is protesting.
