6. REQUEST TO CONSTRUCT WITH CITY FORCES: On approximately February 5, 1980, an 8" water main crossing the Interstate 44 at about 161st E. Ave. broke. The break apparently occurred under the eastbound roadway fill. A 2" galvanized main was pushed through the 8" cast iron line for temporary service; however, volume and pressure is limited.

Drawings were submitted for approval, construction to be done by City forces. This project consists of approximately 1200 feet of 12" water main. Verbal permission has been granted by the Division Highway Engineer to open cut the on and off ramps which will have to be crossed, provided that temporary ramps are constructed to adequately serve the expressway. Additional requirements of the Highway Department have been included in the plans.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Water and Sewer Department be authorized to construct this project with City forces.

Loyd Kenndey, representing the Mobile Home industry, said if this is approved, he wouls like for the mobile home industry to be excluded.

Mr. Campbell read a letter from the Mechanical Board, by Mr. Mayfield which supported the proposal.

Suzeette Birch said the Tulsa Home Owners Coalition gives favorable recommendations for this proposal.

Dan Steffanoff, represented. Associated Independent Electrical Contractors of Tulsa who are in opposition to the proposal.

Mr. Steffanoff said the Fire Marshal was at the Electrical Board meeting and went on record against this ordinance.

Participation in breeding loans with other zoos and private parties is necessary for the proper fulfillment of this obligation.

REDUCTION OF BUILDING PERMIT FEE - McCULLOCH INDUSTRIES PLANT: Communication was presented and reviewed by Charles Norman, attorney representing four Tulsa firms who were selected by the McCulloch industries to design and construct the Tulsa facility: Hammond Engineering, Netherton & Associates; Larkin & Associates, and Flintco. It is requested that the City Commission grant relief to them from the double permit fee. The Building Permit fee is in the amount of \$11,694.50 which under the provisions of the Code, the Building Inspector was required to double same and is charging a fee in the amount of \$23,389. The effect of the double fee requirement imposes a penalty of \$11,694.50 upon the project for the commencement of the work prior to the formal issuance of the Building Permit.

In this instance, four firms were endeavoring to accelerate the design and construction of a facility to accommodate an industry moving to Tulsa which is considered to be a highly desirable addition to the economic base of the community.

Since there were no technical violations of the codes or of any construction practices to date, it is requested that the City Commission grant a waiver of the double portion of the fee, or reduce the amount to be paid to a sum that is in keeping with the nature of an incident which is regretted by all the firms involved.

In discussion, it was noted that a precedent was established which could be followed, wherein the double fee was reduced to \$1000, which was about a third of the double fee in that case. Therefore, Commissioner Hewgley suggested that the same rough percentage be used in this case and that the double fee portion be reduced to \$3500.

However, Commissioner Thomas said that as he remembers the case in point, percentages were not involved, and that the amount of \$1000 was settled on as a reasonable fine or penalty for this type of infraction. He would support a \$1000 penalty.

Following consideration, it was moved by Commissioner Purdie, seconded by Commissioner Thomas that the applicant be granted a waiver of a portion of the double fee, and that a penalty of \$1000 be imposed inhaddition to the regular permit fee.

Wayne Alberty, staff member to TMAPC reviewed the Planning Commission's report and recommendation. He displayed and reviewed maps which are the results of a study made of this area at the request of the Planning Commission.

Upon a call for protests, Wilbur Rogers said he lives across the street, and it would appear that this will be the same as a salvage yard to the detriment of those who have invested in their properties and homes in the area. He wants all of the application denied.

Bill Blan, a property owner to the south, spoke in protest.

David Schaffitzel also spoke in protest, although he would not mind the 300 feet if applicant would not be able to get the rest of the property rezoned. Although he had been approved by the Planning Commission, he has not attempted to move his building.

Mr. Mitchell was present and in answer to questions, said he does not intend to have a salvage yard. He is going to build a home on the property and have a light carburetor business on the portion recommended IL by the Planning Commission, and of course does not want to do anything to be detrimental. He received a Health Dept. permit for septic tank installation today.

Commissioner Young noted that in December, 1978, Mr. Mitchell had stated he would move cars on the property and build a septic tank after the first of the year, but that these things had not been accomplished.

Commissioner Thomas said that this Board is to examine the land use and it would appear that proposed use is a proper land use. If zoning regulations are not complied with stiff penalties can be imposed under the due processof the law. He thinks the standards for IL are sufficient to prevent a salvage yard.

CDBG PUBLIC SERVICE PROJECT TERMINATION: Communication was presented from the Department of City Development and reviewed by Dr. John Piercey, Director.

The staff of the Neighborhood Development Division of the department, after having completed an extensive analysis and review of the performance of Year IV CDBG projects through March 31, 1979, has identified the following Public Service (social service) projects as "out of compliance" with the 55% residency requirements in their contracts:

School Outreach

Juvenile Delinquency Prevention.

These projects failed substantially to serve 55% of their clients from the designated neighborhood strategy areas as required by their contracts and by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, during the first eight months of the Year IV program year and have little chance of bringing their performance up to contract goals during the remaining portion of their contract period.

It is recommended that both projects be terminated effective May 1, 1979, with their unutilized funds returned to the CDBG Contingency Account for reprogramming.

He noted that the Citizens Coalition has concurred with the termination of the School Outreach Program, but does not concur with the recommendation on the Juvenile Delinquency Prevention Program.

All persons present were given an opportunity to be heard.

Carol Wyant listed reasons why she thought the Juvenile Delinquency Prevention Program should continue, noting that the Juvenile Bureau has increased its financial responsibility for the program and has agreed this would the the last year to ask for funding. She further noted that since they have been in operation, they have successfully reduced the amount of juvenile delinquency in the area served, and in effect, they are being penalized for being successful. They could expand their scope of service to educate the people in the area on preventing burglaries and other crimes. The program does not have access to any other than CDBG funds, and they do not want to be out of compliance with HUD requirements, so she asked if they would see if they could use other City monies for this project.

Lawrence G. Myers, Director of the Juvenile Bureau of the District Court, echoed Mrs. Wyant's thoughts and noted that increased activities would move the contract more in compliance. Right now it is meeting 46% of the census tracts and the Citizen's Group has voted to continue the funding cycle through July. Tulsa County and the Juvenile Bureau funds are committed for the year ending June 30. He would be willing to cut off the program to get it through the fiscal year. The success of the program is working against it.

In answer to questions from the Board, Dr. Piercey noted that the sum of \$4600 is involved for May and June and the total amount that HUD could require would be to re-pay the entire amount for the year for the program - \$29,900. If the Commission wishes to grant an exception in this case, it should be done by reviewing other alternative funding possibilities.

Dr. Piercey also was concerned about the large number of other programs which may not be in compliance and would expect waivers if this one is granted.

Commissioner Thomas thought that since this is a successful program, and has failed to maintain its goal to serve 55% of the residency thereby, we will not be opening the door or setting a precedent by permitting it to continue.

Following further consideration, it was moved by Commissioner Hewgley, seconded by Commissioner Thomas that the School Outreach Program be terminated, and that the Resolution thereon be adopted, which is entitled as follows:

INDEPENDENT LOCAL 1776: Mayor Inhofe noted that the large group of persons in attendance are concerned with item 12 on the agenda, and in the interest of time he would recommend same be taken up at this time. He further noted that he has a list of names of people who are to speak on this matter, and he asked that each limit his or her presentation to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  minutes and to identify specific area problems. He said that the secretary would make notes of the specific problems.

Mayor Inhofe called upon James Hilliard, Chief representative of Local 1776 for a brief explanation, who said that the workers he represents are willing to do their job and in the past have performed satisfactorily, but were not faced with the situation they have today.

Lottie Sherman made general statements about Mr. Hilliard, how the workers had sought him to represent them; that Local 1180 has not helped the employees; that the employees have taken punishment from Mr. Richmond; something about fear instilled in the employees in the 2½ minute limit; that the City is still taking dues out of the checks for 1180, and that the union is a form of protection for the employees and if they do not want 1180 they should not be compelled to stay in it. She said that any conflict in the Refuse Department was not caused by the employees but was because the City does not recognize their requests for better conditions and improvements. She said the citizens are not satisfied with the way the City changed the refuse service. She thought the service was better before Mr. Richmond came to the department. She said he has told so many lies the employees don't trust him. She said the equipment is in disrepair and she said some of the dollies are very heavy.

Mayor Inhofe noted there is a definite procedure outline that can be followed to change unions if the employees are not satisfied with the one representing them now. The City Commission has no control over it, but it can be done.

Mr. Hilliard noted that this City Commission did not cause the situation, but it has to deal with it.

Kenneth Russell from the Street Department, said that about 95% of the employees want 1776 to represent them.

Willie Jordan thought the old schedule was better. One curb side and one back yard per week isn't working out. They are to pick up just so much, and there is so much garbage stacked in the back yard pickup that they are not allowed to take it all, and therefore there are lots of complaints.

W.D. Walker has been an employee for 13 years. He thinks the old schedule is better and he doesn't think the citizens are satisfied with the service they are getting with the present schedule. He thinks the department tells the employees one thing and the citizens another.

Mr. Easley has been with the City 9 years, and has never seen anything worse than it is now. If they clock in a minute late, they are docked 15 minutes. One day he made three loads and was told to go out again, when felt like he had done his share, and was told he would be suspended for a day. He will do his job, but he will not be forced to do anything.

Kenneth Barber complained about Phil Richmond. He also favored the old schedule of garbage pickups.

H.F. Roberts complained of unsafe equipment, and slick tires on the trucks.

W.A. Goodwin said he had been with the department 23-24 years. One day they took one of his men from this crew, leaving just himself and one man to work, and when he complained to his foreman, and asked to speak to Mr. Richmond, they wouldn't let him. It is too difficult for two men to work that big a route.

Claude Herron doesn!t like the setup and the docking of 15 minutes time if they are late a minute. He complained of poor vehicles. He thinks they should put every pickup at the curb. He feels the refuse workers are put last.

Jeff Nix, attorney for 1776 suggested the City Commission check the statute on collective bargaining. The problems start at the bottom with Phil Richmond and go to the top to this Commission.

Mr. Hilliard made closing statements. He criticized Phil Richmond and thought he should be replaced.

Barbara Connelly said it is not fair to fire a woman when she gets pregnant. Also she thought they should furnish the Refuse workers with uniforms

Mayor Inhofe said he would meet with the Attorney, Jeff Nix.

ELM PARK AREA APARTMENT BUILDINGS: This date had been set for receiving reports from the several agencies involved with the Elm Park Area Apartment Buildings.

Communication was presented by and reviewed by D.N. Irwin, Chief Building Inspector. In the August 4, 1978, meeting the City Commission concurred in recommendation of Commissioner Hewgley to have the several involved City agencies report on actions taken by each pursuant to findings released at the August 1st meeting.

The Division of Protective Inspections developed a list of fire hazard and safety requirements and provided that list to the Fire Marshal on August 8 for his transmittal to the building owner. A second list of deficiencies relative to minimum liveability standards was provided to the owner, by mail, on August 14, 1978.

Eugene Colleoni was present and said that the area residents want to see progress made in reference to what is contained in the petition.

Commissioner Hewgley said that until the occupants actually physically move from the apartments, the City is just making a plan of action to do what is necessary when they do move out.

Chief Gann, City Fire Marshal, reviwed a list of deficiencies noted by his office. A ten day notice was given to the owner, but the time has not expired for a further check.

Roy Wilson, Health Department representative, said they had served a 30 day notice on the 7th of August for correction of violations.

Mack Kriegel, attorney, representing Mr. Williams, noted that they have done extensive repairs to the fire escape and there is still some painting to be done on that. They immediately began to clean up the whole area, removing trash, etc. Eviction notices have been given to those tenants causing prolbems, running early in September. He thinks they can have the 10 day list completed by Tuesday, and thinks they can have the two apartment buildings up to code within 45 days. He said they have the immediate hazards taken care of and it would appear that after the end of 10 days

It was noted there could be standards, such as a free standing building, private parking facilities, etc.

Commissioner Eagleton disagreed, in that the Police Department would have to know about firearms, etc., and it might be necessary for them to make such inspections.

It was further recommended that the fee structure be investigated.

This provides for 4 classes of cabarets; provides for a temporary cabaret license, and will include a penalty clause which was inadvertently omitted - an increase of the fine from \$20 to a maximum of \$300 for each day of violation.

RELEASE OF PROPERTY BONDS FORFEITED IN DISTRICT COURT: Communication was presented from the Legal Department submitting a Release of Property Bonds that were forfeited in District Court. During 1970 and 1971, Raymond Littles, who died in 1972, posted property bonds to assure appearances of defendants in Municipal Court. Collateral for the bonds was real estate described as Lot 8, Block 6, Northside Addition to the City of Tulsa. The bonds were posted under authority of Oklahoma Stats., Title 59, Section 1324, which also permits them to be filed of record in the Office of the County Clerk. When so filed, they become a lien against the real estate described. A large number of the forfeitkres were later vacated and set aside as is permitted by state law; however, they were not released of record in the County Clerk's Office. Nor was a claim filed against the estate of Mr. Littles within the statutory time limit. Based upon the cases interpreting the Oklahoma forfeiture statutes, the age, number and likelihood of recovery on the bonds, Judge Lawrence Yeagley, Presiding Judge of the Municipal Criminal Court, has recommended that the bonds be released.

The unreleased bonds total approximately \$267,000. The property is worth approximately \$6,000, and TURA is attempting to acquire it.

PROPERTY DAMAGE CLAIM OF NITA HUBBARD: Communication was presented from the Legal Department submitting a property damage claim of Nita Hubbard against the City of Tulsa in the sum of \$20.37. Ms. Hubbard reports that on July 24, 1978, the City was in the process of resurfacing South Wheeling Avenue in the 700 block when an asphalt roller being operated by a City employee struck the rear of her 1970 Toyota automobile, breaking the plastic lens covering the rear brake light. The claimant reports that the City employee advised her that he was unable to stop his machine in time to avoid damage to the claimant's automobile.

The Legal Department investigated this claim and has confirmed the occurrence of an accident as reported by the claimant. Investigation into the dollar value of the damage sustained by the claimant has resulted in the discovery that the plastic taillight lens cover which was broken on the claimant's automobile cost \$5.37, plus tax. The claimant has agreed to accept this sum in full satisfaction of her claim. Legal is satisfied from our investigation that the claimant's damage resulted from the negligent operation of City equipment and, accordingly, recommends that the compromised damage claim be approved.

PROPERTY DAMAGE/PERSONAL INJURY CLAIM OF TODD ALAN BOWEN: Communication was presented from the Legal Department submitting a claim from Mr. Joseph Q. Adams, on behalf of his client Todd Alan Bowen against the City of Tulsa for \$1,753.65 property damage, together with an unspecified amount for personal injuries. Mr. Bowen's motorcycle was damaged beyond repair, and he received unspecified injuries as a result of a collision between his motorcycle and a broken manhole cover which was lying in the East 15 Street roadway at its intersection with South Delaware Place. The accident occurred at approximately 1:00 A.M. on July 8, 1978.

The Legal Department investigated this claim and recommend that this claim be denied. The traffic officer who investigated the claimant's accident reported the exposed manhole opening and the broken manhole lid. The Streets Maintenance Division immediately installed a replacement lid. The broken cover exposed an open manhole located in the center of a very busy street. The claimant struck a portion of the broken manhole cover which was lying in the middle of the two westbound traffic lanes on 15th Street. The City had no knowledge either of a broken manhole cover or an exposed manhole opening on 15th Street prior to the claimant's accident. The maintenance of City streets, including manhole covers, is a proprietary of city streets, including manhole covers, is a proprietary function of a city government and, in the absence of negligence the City is not liable for damages.

PROPERTY DAMAGE CLAIM OF JOE FINER: Communication was presented from the Legal Department submitting a property damage claim against the City of Tulsa from Joe Finer in the amount of \$285. Mr. Finer reports that City Streets Maintenance personnel have removed a portion of his lawn, causing a major eyesore in front of his house. He further complains that the pavement in front of his home has been damaged by City trucks. The claim submitted represents the cost of replacing the sod which was removed by City personnel.

The claim has been investigated by the Legal Department. The claimant's property is at the corner of Sleepy Hollow Drive and East 74th Street in Tulsa. These streets are not curbed and guttered, but, instead, rely solely upon bar ditch swales adjacent to the street. In the course of time, the claimant has filled in the bar ditch adjacent to his property, resulting in the obstruction of a drainage culvert under 74th Street. As a result of this obstruction, drainage from the claimant's property could not enter the culvert, the roadway could not properly be drained, resulting in its damage, and surface water was being forced to cross the roadway, resulting in problems for the claimant's neighbors. The City's action in restoring the functioning of the drainage swale adjacent to the public roadway and the functioning of its drainage culvert occurred entirely within the dedicated roadway for the street, not upon the claimant's property as alleged.

DENIAL OF PROPERTY DAMAGE CLAIM: Communication was presented from the City Legal Department recommending denial of the property damage claim submitted by Mr. and Mrs. Douglas A. Downing in the amount of \$2,000. The claimants report that a large tree located in front of their home was damaged in a storm and they requested the City to remove a large broken limb which was hanging loosely over the street and was hazardous to pedestrians. Claimants further report that they had maintained the tree and it was in excellent condition, except for the broken limb. In response to their request to the City, a City crew proceeded to remove the entire tree. Claimants further state that the tree's removal has resulted in a landscape imbalance on their property.

The removal of the tree has been confirmed; however, the tree was not located in the claimants' yard, but was immediately adjacent to the curb and well within the City's right-of-way. State law provides that trees growing in the public right-of-way are subject to the supervision of the municipality over its streets. The City crew which removed the subject tree acted in good faith upon their determination that the tree should be removed to ensure public safety.

DENIAL OF PROPERTY DAMAGE CLAIM - DAVID W. MILLER: Mr. Robert C. Gates, on behalf of his client David W. Miller, has submitted a claim against the City of Tulsa in the amount of \$2,100. In 1974, the City contracted with H.J. Happel Co. for the installation of a trunk water line in the right-of-way of South Mingo Road. Mr. Miller's property abuts Mindo Road and three very large trees stood in front of his property in close proximity to the intended course for the City's water line. In recognition of this fact, Mr. Miller conveyed an additional right-of-way across his property for the purpose of routing the City's water line around his trees. Subsequent to the installation of the water line, the trees died. The contractor offered Mr. Miller the sum of \$500 to settle his claim, which is viewed by him as an unacceptable settlement offer. The claim submitted represents the cost of removing the dead trees and replacing them with smaller nursery trees.

H.J. Happel Co. was the City's contractor on this bond project improvement and is legally in the status of an independent contractor. A dispute has been ongoing between Mr. Miller and H.J. Happel since January of 1976. The Water and Sewer Department, the City Legal Department and the consulting engineering firm who had control over the water line installation have all attempted to assist Mr. Miller in obtaining satisfaction from the City's contractor. However, no legal basis can be found which would fix ultimate responsibility upon the City of Tulsa.

AIRPORT INDUSTRIAL CENTER: On September 1, 1978, William Buffington, developer, asked the City Commission for a Resolution ratifying the plat of Airport Industrial Center. At that time the City Commission continued the matter to this date and asked the TMAPC Staff to transmit copies of the Minutes of the TMAPC concerning their approval of said plat.

Communications were presented from the TMAPC and reviewed by Wayne Alberty, staff member, submitting the Minutes of the Planning Commission which approved Airport Industrial Center Addition located in Section 33-20-14, at the SW corner of Pine & North 145th East Avenue on February 15, 1978, and its subsequent release on July 12, 1978.

Mr. Alberty displayed a copy of the plat which has been filed of record and noted that same was released by the Planning Commission after July 1. He noted that it is now required by state law under the Municipal Code that the City Commission endorse its approval of the plat prior to same being filed of record. Airport Industrial Center Plat has been processed and released, and all utility companies and City agencies are satisfied.

INDIAN ACRES ASSESSMENT DISTRICT: On September 1, 1978, Wesley A. Pitcock requested that the ditch aligned to run mostly on his property in Lot 5 Block 2 Memorial Acres, a part of Indian Acres Assessment District, be divided equally between his property and his neighbor to the south. Also he asked whether the channel could be installed underground. The matter was continued to this date for report from the City Engineer. and the first section of the contract of the contract of

City Engineer C. Harold Miller submitted and reviewed a report from R.W. Steele & Associates, Inc., which is the engineering firm responsible for the design of the Indian Acres project delineating the rationale of the alignment and design of the outfall drainage facility from the Indian Acres detention facility.

Mr. Miller noted, that in reviewing the design and rationale, the Engineering Department concurs in the design and finds that it is consistent and in accordance with all approved design criteria of the City of Tulsa. He displayed a map thereof.

Mr. Pitcock was present and said that although he has reviewed a copy of Mr. Steele's report, he still asks whether that ditch can be divided.

Mr. Steele was called upon to answer questions. He said his firm has reviewed this property in depth over the past 3 years. He said they studied the drainage lines along Mr. Pitcock's property and the adjacent owner, Mr. Moore, and feels whichever way they go, it will not satisfy all parties concerned, but thinks this is the most feasible way to meet the criteria standards. There will be no cost to the district for the construction of the drainage facility along the alignment shown. The drainage gets quite deep in there, and there is about a 9 foot elevation, so it is imperative to follow the natural drainage.

As far as underground system as requested by Mr. Pitcock, his firm studied the use of various methods, but there is no practical way the district can be drained except by an open earth lined channel. He said that they went back into the records and found an aerial photo taken in February, 1950. The drainage pattern at that time was virtually the same as this. From aerial photo taken in 1963, they observed two bonds on Mr. Moore's property and Mr. Pitcock's property and one further downstream. Those ponds have been filled in and are gone. It is his opinion that the drainage has been hampered and there is no way for the water to get through without an adequate drainage facility.

Mr. Steele said the District has some land it can trade with Mr. Pitcock so that any loss can be fully recovered by Mr. Pitcock. He mentioned other benefits which might be derived when 21st Place is vacated.

Mayor Inhofe pointed out that these negotiation proposals are not proper for this Commission to consider and suggested they be worked out another place and time.

Mr. Rubin Haye, Engineering staff member, stated that the proposed plan meets the City's criteria. An alternate placement of the channel would require more right-of-way from Lot 3 and would cause a cut off in the middle of Lot 4. It is his opinion that the proposed alignment as presented by Mr. Steel is the most feasible plan.

Mr. Steele said he feels the division was fair when considering the location of the houses in place, etc.

Commissioner Eagleton in discussion said she agrees that it is a matter of negotiation as to compensation etc. to the property owner, regardless of where the channel goes. She will support the alignment as it appears on the map before us.

CETA TITLE III YETP AND YCCIP GRANT APPLICATIONS: Communication was presented from the Community Development Department and reviewed by Joyce Stewart noting that the Tuls a Area Manpower Consortium (Tulsa Creek and Osage Counties) is eligible for funding under Subpart II, Youth Community Conservation and Improvement Projects (YCCIP) and Subpart III, Youth Employment and Training Program (YETP) of the YEDPA.

On September 9, 1977 the City Commission approved the receipt of a Department of Labor YEDPA Planning Grant in the amount of \$26,424 to prepare the comprehensive grant applications now being presented for consideration.

Total grant funds requested from the Department of Labor to implement said CETA Title III Youth Program is \$691,461 - \$528,470 is for the YETP program and \$162,991 is for the YCCIP Program. REQUEST FOR GENERAL REVENUE SHARING FUNDS FOR WATER & SEWER DEPARTMENT REHABILITATION GRANT FROM EDA: Communication was presented from the Community Development Department and reviewed by Shirl Butler noting that on September 22, 1977, EDA approved a grant of \$175,000 to the City of Tulsa for renovation of the Water and Sewer Department office building and warehouse.

An analysis of the bids received for this project indicated a bid could be awarded within the grant amount -- if all deductive alternates were excluded.

However, two of these alternates included mandatory requirements for handicapped facilities. Also, due to bid conditions stipulating the order of exclusion of deductive alternates, it will be necessary to include other deductive alternates. In summary, it will require an additional \$40,000 (estimated) in order to award a bid for renovation of the water and Sewer Department buildings.

A new bulletin issued by the EDA allows the City to request that funds from LPW II projects that are bid and/or let in an amount under the grant award- be transferred to projects exceeding the grant amount.

1 17 7 20 7 1 1 1 1 It is noted that the Water and Sewer Department waterline LPW II projects awarded by the Commission November 22, 1977, were \$48,473.65, under the amount of the grant.

It would appear feasible upon completion of the waterline projects, to request transfer of an amount equal to the underrun to the building renovations overrun. However, in the interim it will be necessary for the City to guarantee the funds necessary to complete the overrun experienced in the building renovation bid, with a letter from the Mayor to that effect.

The Budget office has indicated that General Revenue Sharing Funds are available for this purpose and and will require Commission approval to transfer the additional \$40,000 in GRS funds to the EDA Local Public Works Fund 5901, which is currently established at \$1,4 million for a total of \$1,440,000.

Assistant City Attorney Neal McNeill indicates there are no legal barriers in the bid specifications to awarding a bid, the conditions noted are met.

It is recommended that the City Commission authorize an additional \$40,000 for EDA-Local Public Works Fund 5901 and approve a letter committing the City of Tulsa to fund the difference between the EDA grant amount established for the Water and Sewer Department building renovation and the actual bid awarded for that renovation, and authorize the Mayor to sign.
