Who makes up city government? And what do they do?



The Mayor

Administrative Branch:

- Acts as chief administrator and manages Tulsa's everyday operations.
- Duties:
 - Managing all administrative departments
 - Executing municipal laws
 - Submitting an annual budget to the City Council
 - Appointing citizens to authorities, boards, and commissions (ABCs)
- Term: Four-year term (elected by the whole city)
- Current Mayor: Monroe Nichols (<u>mayor@cityoftulsa.org</u>)



The City Auditor

Investigative Branch:

- Serves as an independent eye that periodically reviews Tulsa's operations, resources, and financial activities.
- Duties:
 - Providing accountability to the city government
 - Ensuring resources are effectively and efficiently utilized
 - Conducting annual audits
 - Providing government oversight
 - Ensuring adequate protections are in place to manage risk
 - Regularly reviewing the City's financial activities
- Term: Two-year term (elected by the whole city)

The City Council

Legislative Branch:

- Operates as the legislative branch of the city government.
- Duties:
 - Listening to the concerns and suggestions of their districts' residents
 - Adopting municipal ordinances and resolutions
 - Approving the City's annual budget
 - Evaluating the overall effectiveness of city operations
 - Confirming citizens to authorities, boards, and commissions (ABCs)
 - Leading special council projects (listed on <u>tulsacouncil.org/</u>)
- Term: Two-year term (elected by the whole city)

What is an ABC?

Groups of residents, appointed to authorities, boards and commissions (ABCs), provide their elected leaders with information and recommendations to assist the City's decision-making processes.

Total ABCs in Tulsa: 47



ABCs

What do they do?

Each ABC has a specific focus, but generally they all accomplish the same tasks:

- Recommending the creation of city policies and programs
- Acquiring, managing, and/or overseeing the management of assets
- Reviewing and recommending policy changes to the Mayor and City Council



ABCs

How to serve on an ABC:

For all mayor-appointed positions, you must be a Tulsa resident. *Some boards have additional requirements*.

When do you contact 311?

When you need to report a(n)...

- Abandoned vehicle
- Aggressive or loose animal
- Broken parking meter
- Dead animal pickup
- Graffiti
- Illegal dumping
- Missed trash pick up
- Pothole



When do you contact 311?

When you need to report a(n)...

- Streetlight maintenance request
- Sewer line break / overflow*
- Traffic light / sign issue
- Traffic sign / street marker issue
- Trash / junk debris
- Yard / lot maintenance
- Water line break*

*There is a direct phone number to call to report water and sewer line breaks and overflows.

Communication Tips



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Communication Tips

- Be clear and specific about what you need / want
- Provide photos and/or a map
- Provide context for the issue / idea
- Detail the impact (provide data if you have it)
- Keep a log of who you've spoken to (with dates)
- Ask for timelines (for responses / decisions / etc.)
- Ask about follow up procedures


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General Tips



General Tips

- Build relationships with city staff and elected officials.
- Participate in surveys, events and initiatives gathering citizen input.
- Stay connected. Follow the City's social media.
- Tune in to TGOV to watch important meetings when you can't attend in person.
