

Tulsa's Response Models

Community Response Team (CRT)

Rapid response team that works to de-escalate individuals in mental health crisis

Two Alternative Response Teams (ART)

- Provides wrap around services
- ART-2: Dedicated unit in Downtown Tulsa

Integrated Response Team (IRT)

COPES mental health-only teams
