This document describes all job classifications in this job family which vary in grade level as indicated below. PURPOSE OF THE CLASSIFICATION: Under general supervision, positions in this class perform treatment and transportation of biosolids including: hauling biosolids and heavy equipment to land sites for application following established procedures, which include local, state, and federal guidelines; material handling, process monitoring, and reporting associated with biosolids land application and composting; ensures operations are successfully performed to create Class "A" compost; and other related duties as assigned.

WORKING ENVIRONMENT:

Working environment for LT-17 and LT-18 positions are primarily outdoors and in inclement weather. Employees may be directed to work at multiple facilities on an as needed basis. The working environment for AT-28 position is primarily outdoors and in inclement weather with some work performed indoors in an office setting and requires travel to multiple locations for field examinations/inspections.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Physical requirements for LT-17, LT-18, and AT-28 positions include occasional walking and standing; frequent lifting and carrying up to 60 pounds; occasional lifting and carrying up to 105 pounds; pushing and pulling up to 60 pounds; frequent climbing, stooping, reaching, bending, handling, and twisting; and vision, speech, and hearing sufficient to perform the essential tasks.

LT-17 | BIOSOLIDS OPERATOR I

CLASS CODE: 7562

ESSENTIAL TASKS:

- Operates equipment such as pull trucks, tankers, end dumps, and front-end loaders to move or transport sludge, biosolids, compost and mulch
- Drives defensively and operates vehicles in a safe manner
- Maintains assigned equipment, ensuring proper usage and storage, and reporting any issues to management
- Operates various pieces of motorized equipment on a regularly designated basis
- Checks for proper functioning of the equipment during operation and makes needed adjustments
- Performs preventative maintenance on equipment, including operational pre-check, and services equipment with proper fluids and lubricants
- Documents temperatures of compost piles
- Ensures daily logs are accurate and complete
- Assists with the sampling and survey of lagoons and drying beds
- Must report to work on a regular and timely basis

LT-18 | BIOSOLIDS OPERATOR II

CLASS CODE: 7563

ESSENTIAL TASKS:

- Acts as lead person in the instruction of crew workers in the land application or composting of biosolids, as requested by management
- Operates pull trucks, tankers, end dumps, and front-end loaders to move or transport sludge, biosolids, compost and mulch
- Operates tractor with attachments and other motorized equipment for the land application of biosolids
- Communicates information effectively and accurately with team members and supervisors to accomplish work goals
- Transports equipment from one field to another using a lowboy trailer
- Ensures composting operations are successfully performed to include: mixing, composting, screening, curing and storage
- Trains in the proper techniques of transporting sludge, land applying biosolids, and production of Class "A" compost, as requested by management
- Determines appropriate ratios of mulch to sludge for proper composting mixture
- Ensures effective operation of compost screening
- Assists in the survey of lagoons and drying beds
- Must report to work on a regular and timely basis

AT-28 | BIOSOLIDS LEAD

CLASS CODE: 7564

ESSENTIAL TASKS:

- Leads the operation of sludge hauling and land application or composting of biosolids
- Reviews the shift's transportation of sludge and land application or composting of biosolids and ensures proper staffing on assigned shift
- Determines when compost has met class "A" requirements and can be ready for distribution
- Maintains and updates the documentation of land application of composting of biosolids and the distribution of all class "A" compost in the data management system
- Maintains a supply of consumable parts for equipment used in the production of compost
- Coordinates subordinates and outside contractors in transportation and land application
- Researches, investigates, and writes equipment specifications for procurement
- Coordinates the crew's equipment preventative maintenance and repair program and other maintenance activities as required
- Leads employee general training programs for assigned crew
- Coordinates the cleanup efforts of crew members regarding the spill of biosolids

- Assists the supervisor in ensuring all employees complete various training requirements
- Must report to work on a regular and timely basis

- b) Four (4) years' of progressively responsible experience relevant to the essential tasks in this job description
