TULSA UTILIZES NEW POLLUTANT FACILITY


The Tulsa Household Pollutant Collection Facility celebrated its one-year anniversary in January 2017. Replacing the semi-annual collection events held for many years at Tulsa Fairgrounds, this facility provides a permanent and more convenient system for disposing of household pollutants at no cost for Tulsa residents. Use of this facility helps Tulsa accomplish its goal of keeping pollutants out of creeks, streams and service systems.

In its first year of operation, the facility collected 89,459 pounds of household pollutants from 1,326 customers. In late 2016, the City of Tulsa also allowed nearby members of the Metropolitan Environmental Trust and residents throughout the region to drop off household pollutants for a fee. More than 80 residents from outside the Tulsa city limits have utilized the service so far.

The Household Pollutant Collection Facility is located at 4502 S. Galveston Ave., and is open every Wednesday and Saturday by appointment from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Tulsa residents can make an appointment by calling 311. CITY CLOSINGS MAY AFFECT SCHEDULE

City Hall and other City facilities are closed on the holidays listed below. Trash and recycling service may or may not be affected. Trash collection will occur as normal on holidays marked with a double asterisk (**).

The collection schedule will be adjusted for holidays with no trash or recycling service. For Monday holidays, customers whose trash is collected on Mondays will be collected on Tuesday; Tuesday customers will be collected on Wednesday; Wednesday customers will be collected on Thursday; Thursday customers will be collected on Friday; and Friday customers will be collected on Saturday.

For twice-a-week collection, Monday/Thursday customers will be collected on Tuesday and Friday; Tuesday/Friday customers will be collected on Wednesday and Saturday; and Wednesday/ Saturday customers will be collected on Thursday and Saturday.

For Tuesday, July 4: Tuesday customers will be collected on Wednesday; Wednesday customers will be collected on Thursday; Thursday customers will be collected on Friday; and Friday customers will be collected on Saturday. Tuesday/ Friday collection customers will be collected on Wednesday and Saturday.

For Thanksgiving (always Thursday), Thursday and Friday customers' schedules will change. Thursday customers will be collected on Friday. Friday customers will be collected on Saturday. Monday/Thursday customers will be collected on Monday and Friday, and Tuesday/Friday customers will be collected on Tuesday and Saturday.

BACKFLOW PREVENTION

PROTECT OUR PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM

The City's Water & Sewer Department is dedicated to ensuring the water delivered to your home is safe to drink. However, situations outside of the City's control may jeopardize the quality of your drinking water by allowing backflow into the public water system.

Backflow is the reverse flow of water from a plumbing system into the public water system. **Cross-connections** can occur between the public water system and anything else allowing the **backflow** of foreign materials into the system.

Follow these simple precautions to help protect our drinking water system from backflow events:

- Never submerge hoses in buckets, pools, tubs, sinks or other containers.
- Always keep hose ends clear of possible contaminants. An air gap of 2 inches or more between the hose end and the receptacle is the safest and simplest way to prevent backflow.
- Don't tamper with the temperature and pressure valves on hot water tanks. These valves will discharge when there is thermal expansion in the tank. Install a thermal expansion tank if necessary.
- Buy and install inexpensive backflowprevention devices called vacuum breakers for all faucets in your home.
- Don't use garden hose spray attachments to apply chemicals without using a vacuum breaker at the faucet. Lawn or cleaning chemicals are toxic and may be fatal if ingested.





DUMPSTERS AVAILABLE

REQUEST FOR NEIGHBORHOOD CLEANUPS

The City of Tulsa's Neighborhood Dumpster Program is a service available to registered neighborhood associations to perform neighborhood clean-up activities. Participating groups can request two 30-yard containers every six months to dispose of eligible household items.

The City of Tulsa recently purchased more dumpsters and an additional hauling vehicle for this program. This will significantly reduce wait times for dumpsters and allow more areas of the City to be served.

Dumpsters are for use at residential sites and cannot be used for commercial purposes (for example, to clean out rental properties). Certain items cannot be placed in the dumpsters, such as limbs and other tree debris, grass clippings, Freon bearing appliances, car parts or tires, air conditioners, roofing materials, whole buildings, sheds or garages.

Do not overfill dumpsters. Dumpsters should be no more than three-fourths (3/4) full, so that they are easily transported to the landfill. Items cannot be placed on the ground around the dumpster.
