CLASS TITLE: CRIME AND INTELLIGENCE ANALYST

PURPOSE OF THE CLASSIFICATION: Under general supervision provides technical, analytical and investigative assistance to police officers, investigators and agents locally, statewide and nationally to aid in the identification, investigation and arrest of criminal/terrorist offenders and/or conspirators and performs other related assigned duties.

ESSENTIAL TASKS:

- Utilizes multi-agency data sharing system and other sources to conduct analysis and evaluation of criminal, terrorist or conspirator activity
- Researches and analyzes statistical information and prepares and presents linkage charts showing criminal/terrorist association/organizations, commodity flow, events, and net worth assessments, identifying patterns and trends
- Prepares reports indicating or supporting the probability of criminal and/or terrorists activity using various information sources
- Posts electronic notices of persons/items to allow access by field officers in multiple jurisdictions
- Responds to requests for investigative assistance, interfacing with local, state and federal agents, police officers and investigators
- Attends meetings with members of other TPD Divisions, criminal justice agencies and the State Intelligence Fusion Center to obtain or disseminate information
- May testify in court
- Must report to work on a regular and timely basis

Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential tasks.

QUALIFICATIONS:

<u>Training and Experience</u>: Graduation from an accredited college or university with an bachelor's degree in behavioral science, statistics, mathematics, criminal justice or a related field; and three (3) years of experience in specialized research and analysis; or an equivalent combination of training and experience per Personnel Policies and Procedures Section 128.

Knowledge, Abilities and Skills: Comprehensive knowledge of methods and techniques used in researching, compiling, sorting, evaluating and analyzing relevant statistical information to perform crime analysis and criminal investigations; good knowledge of criminal/terrorists profiles and crime patterns; and good knowledge of Microsoft Office computer software. Ability to prepare technical reports on a variety of subjects; ability to utilize inductive reasoning to develop hypothesis; ability to assist a variety of personnel, both internally and externally; ability to deal effectively with individuals in complex and controversial situations; ability to summarize and disseminate information in a clear and effective manner; ability to discreetly handle sensitive and confidential information; and the ability to understand and influence the behavior of others within the organization, customers or the public in order to achieve job objectives and cause action or understanding.

<u>Physical Requirements:</u> Physical requirements include arm and hand dexterity enough to use a keyboard, 10-key and telephone; occasional lifting, carrying, pushing and pulling up to 50 pounds; may be subject to sitting for extended periods of time, walking, standing, reaching and bending; and vision, speech and hearing sufficient to perform the essential tasks.

<u>Licenses and Certificates:</u> Possession of a valid Oklahoma Class "D" Operator's License; and the applicable criminal analyst certification as determined by the department within an appropriate timeframe.

WORKING ENVIRONMENT: Working environment is primarily indoors in an office setting with high noise and toxic fumes; and may have minimal exposure to narcotics.
