CLASS TITLE: CREW LEADER I

PURPOSE OF THE CLASSIFICATION: Under general supervision acts as a working leadsperson in performing unskilled and

semiskilled tasks while working as a member of a crew engaged in hazardous, heavy construction and/or major repair activities

involving City services or facilities and performs other related assigned duties.

ESSENTIAL TASKS:

- Performs lead work such as planning activities according to priorities, problem solving and decision making
- Participates with other members of a crew in a variety of construction and major repair tasks
- Inspects, repairs, cleans and maintains water or sewer lines and catch basins
- Repairs and installs pipes, valves, hydrants and related facilities
- Operates, maintains and directs use of various types of hand and power equipment
- Operates and maintains a variety of heavy automotive equipment
- Completes all related paperwork
- Installs and removes shoring equipment
- Maintains worksite safety
- Maintains tool and material inventory
- Trims and removes shrubs and trees
- Trains other employees of a lower job classification in a variety of heavy hazardous construction and major repair activities
- Directs cleanup of work area and equipment when job is completed

Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential tasks.

QUALIFICATIONS:

<u>Training and Experience:</u> Graduation from high school or possession of a General Educational Development Certificate (GED) and three (3) years of experience performing applicable major repair and heavy construction work; or an equivalent combination of training and experience per Personnel Policies and Procedures, Section 128.

<u>Knowledge, Abilities, and Skills:</u> Good knowledge of manual work practices, methods, tools and materials of varied, semiskilled, heavy construction work; and good knowledge of the hazards and safety precautions of the work. Ability to understand and follow verbal and written directions; ability to lead a crew of workers performing manual labor for extended periods of time in varying weather conditions; ability to read and interpret plans and specifications; and the ability to understand and influence the behavior of others within the organization, customers or the public in order to achieve job objectives and cause action or understanding.

<u>Physical Requirements:</u> Physical requirements include frequent walking and standing; frequent lifting, carrying, pushing and pulling up to 60 pounds; frequent balancing, bending, kneeling, handling, feeling, climbing and twisting; occasional crawling and smelling; and vision, speech and hearing sufficient to perform the essential tasks.

<u>Licenses and Certificates:</u> Possession of a valid Oklahoma Class "D" Operator's License. Some positions within this classification may require an appropriate water/wastewater license as issued by the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ); some positions within this classification may require a Class "A" Commercial Driver's License (CDL) with an "N" endorsement.

WORKING ENVIRONMENT: Working environment is primarily outdoors and in inclement weather. May be exposed to the following: animal waste/dead animals, flammable liquids, traffic, cramped work area, excessive dust, weather/temperature extremes, trench excavations, underground gas/electric/petroleum lines, rough terrains, cutting/chipping/grinding, hazardous/toxic atmospheres, Page 2 (continued from Crew Leader I)

sewage, damp/wet surfaces, snow/ice covered surfaces, animal, snake and insect bites, toxic fumes/vapors/odors, confined spaces and compressed gases.
