Tulsa wins competitive award to help target investment

The City of Tulsa's work to make the community a more attractive destination has led to a national award that will help local leaders use smart growth principles to facilitate decisions.

Tulsa is one of six communities nationwide to receive the Smart Growth America free technical assistance workshop in 2017. Through the program, Tulsa will receive handson assistance from national experts on Planning for Economic and Fiscal Health and Fiscal Impact Analysis. The interactive, hands-on workshops are designed to spur investment through collaborative planning for long-term economic and fiscal health. Smart Growth America is a national nonprofit that advocates for better cities, towns, and neighborhoods.
