To become an Innovation Champion, you'll need to complete the training course. Participants will watch videos, complete exercises, attend classes, and most importantly complete a continuous improvement project that will benefit their work group. The training includes an overview of continuous improvement methods including LEAN and Six Sigma. Participants will learn about how to listen to customers, identify waste and root causes of problems and test out innovative solutions.

In addition to the 20.5 hours of meeting/class time we estimate that participants will spend approximately 2 hours per week on modules, exercises, and project work.
